

STANDARDS OF STUDENT CONDUCT FOR FIELD STUDIES

Students participating in College of the Canyons' Field Studies Programs should never forget that they are representing the College of the Canyons.

- Any misconduct on the part of program participants may reflect on the Field Study Program as a whole, and may produce undesirable results for all program participants.
- Abuse of the hospitality of a host facility on the part of a few may result in the loss of opportunities for many.
- While on Field Studies Programs, students remain subject to all college regulations on student conduct.
- It is important that all program participants observe and abide by the guidelines of both the college and the host facility.
- Participants in Field Studies may be subject to dismissal from the program if they violate college rules or otherwise conduct themselves in such a way as to jeopardize or embarrass themselves, their fellow students, or the Field Studies Program.
- In most cases, dismissal means that student status will be terminated and students will be sent home at their own expense.
- Students may be subject to dismissal under certain conditions, including, but not limited to the following situations:
 - Failure to attend class and participate in required program activities;
 - Failure to maintain an acceptable level of academic performance;
 - Misconduct as defined in the Student Handbook, College Catalog, and/or in the Schedule of Classes.
 - Trade in, consumption of, or other involvement in the use of dangerous or illegal drugs or narcotics, or violation of any local law or ordinance with respect to these substances.
 - Violations of regulations established by the host facility.
