ADMJUS 202 CUSTODY ASSISTANT

Units: 8.00 - CSU

Prerequisite: Must be 18 years of age or older

Trains students to assist deputy sheriffs in supervising the conduct of inmates, how to process inmate records, prepare inmates for court appearances, assign classification of security categories and supervise inmate visitation.

Students must successfully pass a written examination, medical examination covering all aspects of health, a physical agility and strength test, psychological evaluation, and extensive background investigation. These tests must be successfully completed under published guidelines of various individual police departments and public safety agencies, the Los Angeles County Health Department, the Los Angeles County Civil Service Commission and State of California as directed by the Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST). REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES.

ADMJUS 250 BASIC ACADEMY

Units: 14.00-22.00 - CSU

Prerequisite: Students must successfully pass a written examination, physical agility and strength test, comprehensive medical examination, intensive personal background investigation, and psychiatric evaluation.

Test results must comply with the published guidelines of individual agencies and police departments, including the Los Angeles County Health Department, Los Angeles County Civil Service Commission, and the State of California as directed by Peace Officers Standards and Training. REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES.

Provides training in basic law enforcement tactics, and techniques specifically used by California law enforcement agencies.

ADMJUS 291 RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING LEVEL III

Units: 3.00-4.50 - CSU

Prerequisite: California driver's license, no felony or specific misdemeanor convictions, DOJ firearms possession and use certification, successful P.O.S.T. reading and writing mandated test, psychiatric evaluation, intensive personal background investigation and certification of physical fitness.

A demanding and highly structured course of fundamental instruction that will award the student a certification of Level III status upon successful completion. This course may be repeated if used for legally mandated training.

ADMJUS 292 RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING LEVEL II

Units: 3.00-6.00 - CSU

Prerequisite: California driver's license, no felony or specific misdemeanor convictions, DOJ firearm possession and use certification, successful P.O.S.T. reading and writing mandated test, psychiatric evaluation, intensive personal background investigation and certification of physical fitness.

A demanding and highly structured course of medium level instruction that will award the student a certification of Level II status upon successful completion. Completion of the 292 hours will also certify the student's ability to proceed to Level I training. This course may be repeated if used for legally mandated training.

ADMJUS 293 RESERVE OFFICER TRAINING LEVEL I

Units: 5.00 - CSU

Prerequisite: California driver's license, no felony or specific misdemeanor convictions, DOJ firearm possession and use certification, successful P.O.S.T. reading and writing mandated test, psychiatric evaluation, intensive personal background investigation and certification of physical fitness.

The highest level of Reserve Officer carrying with it the equivalency of having completed a Basic P.O.S.T. Academy. The most demanding and highly structured course of the 799 hour Reserve Officer program, this course awards the student a certification of Level I status upon successful completion. May be repeated if used for legally mandated training.

ADVANCED TRAINING EDUCATION - ADMJUS

The college, in conjunction with various community partner agencies, provides additional advanced training courses that are approved by the Commission of Peace Officer Standards Training (P.O.S.T.). These courses are listed as part of the ADMJUS or PUBSAF series (listed under Public Safety), and are available for review in the Schedule of Classes and online at www.canyons.edu. Due to the duty assignments of instructors at the training centers, certain classes may be cancelled, dates changed or classes rescheduled. Each course has its own title and letter designation in the class schedule. Offered credit/no credit only. REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES. This course may be repeated if used for legally mandated training.

ADMJUS 198 ADVANCED OFFICER TRAINING

Units: 0.25-10.00 - CSU

Advanced officer training with a variable format depending on subject matter. Course content includes new topics and refresher material from all areas of law enforcement responsibility such as law, firearms, first aid, and patrol procedures. Designed for upgrading currently employed law enforcement personnel. This course may be repeated if used for legally mandated training. Offered credit/no-credit only. REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES.
