FIRETC 085 FIREFIGHTER SKILLS

Units: 0.50-1.00

Recommended Preparation: Completion of courses required for the Fire Technology Pre-Service Certificate of Achievement.

Covers basic firefighter manipulative skills required by National Fire Protection Association Standard 1001.

FIRETC 097 FIREFIGHTER CAP TRAINING

Units: 0.50-5.00

Provides manipulative skills instruction in various firefighting techniques and subjects related to Fire Technology, including organizational development, fire service appliances, fire chemistry, automatic fire extinguishers and agents, ladders, and hose operations. Topics to be announced per semester, consult current class schedule.

FIRETC 201 INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM 200

Units: 1.00 - CSU

Intended for fire personnel who understand the Incident Command System. Develops the necessary foundation for the student to participate as a member of a wildland fire incident team. Topics include the principles and features of ICS, organizational overview, incident facilities, incident resources, and common responsibilities.

REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES.

FIRETC 202 I-300 INTERMEDIATE (ICS) INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM

Units: 0.25-4.00 - CSU

For fire personnel who have an intermediate-level requirement for understanding the Incident Command System. A continuation of ICS training for members of a wildland fire incident team. REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES.

FIRETC “L” SERIES

Units: .25 – 11.00

Variable format depending on subject matter. Course content includes refresher material from all areas related to ocean life-guard employment, operation, service. Major topics include CPR, first aid, rescue drills, EMT, watercraft operations, swimming, rescue and diving proficiency and communication.

REGISTRATION IS LIMITED TO STUDENTS WHO HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED PROGRAM PREREQUISITES. May be repeated if used for legally mandated training.

FIRETC L1 OCEAN LIFEGUARD TRAINING ACADEMY

Units: 13.50
