Cooperative Work Experience Education (CWEE)

The Cooperative Work Experience Education and Internship program is designed to “Connect College to Careers,” strengthen student learning and improve the likelihood of career success by:

- Engaging students in enhanced on-the-job learning opportunities at their present workplace.
- Providing meaningful paid and unpaid internship opportunities to students of all majors.
- Helping students apply the skills and knowledge acquired in their academic coursework while adhering to generally accepted business principles, standards work ethics.
- Research shows that students who participate in work-based learning programs such as CWEE, Internships and Service Learning, find full-time jobs faster and earn more money than classmates who do not participate.
- Employers offer full-time jobs to nearly 69% of students who had internships with their company.

Students earn elective units by using the community as the classroom and completing independent career related assignments.

EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE YOU WORK!

Whether already employed, volunteering, or seeking an internship through the CWEE program, you may be eligible to earn CSU transferable elective CWEE units or apply them to an associate degree while working on-the-job.

Even if you work in a job unrelated to your career goal (General CWEE), you can participate in our program and earn up to 3 units of CSU transferable elective units per semester for the skills you learn on the job. Those students

working within their major (Occupational CWEE), may earn up to 4 units of CSU transferable elective units per semester. Students may also continue our program in future semesters to enhance their on-the-job skills while earning additional CSU transferable elective units. General CWEE students can earn up to a total of 6 units of CSU transferable elective units (3 units per semester), and Occupational CWEE students can earn up to a total of 16 units of CSU transferable elective units (4 units per semester).

COURSE ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

1. Student must be working in a paid or unpaid position. (Note: Student can only be enrolled in one CWEE course at a time.)
2. Determine whether you qualify for Occupational Work Experience or General Work Experience. (See below)
3. Determine the number of units to be taken based on the number of hours you will work during the semester. (See below)
4. Look up the appropriate CWEE section number in the schedule of classes and enroll.
5. Attend a mandatory CWEE Orientation (See dates listed on next page).

Should I enroll in Occupational Work Experience or General Work Experience?

- **Occupational Work Experience:** To qualify, your college major or career goal and your work must be related.
- Or -
- **General Work Experience:** If your employment is not related to your major, or you have not declared a major at COC, you may enroll in the General Work Experience (GENSTU CWEXP).

GENERAL WORK EXPERIENCE

Not Related

Music Major - *food industry job*
 Computer Major - *entertainment job*
 Welding Major - *insurance job*

OCCUPATIONAL WORK EXPERIENCE ENROLLMENT

Students can register for 1 to 4 units depending on the number of hours worked during the semester and if the work is paid or unpaid.
