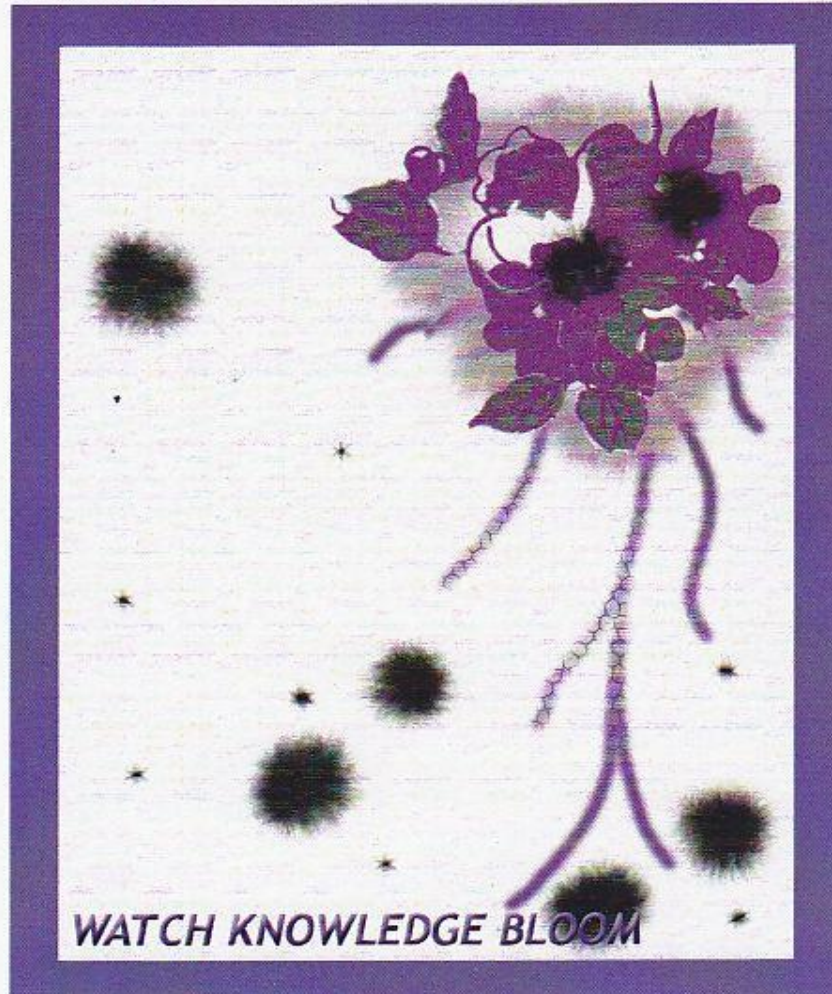

HONORS TRANSFER COUNCIL OF CALIFORNIA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT RESEARCH CONFERENCE

Each year, the Honors Transfer Council of California showcases the research of some of our honors programs' best students at the Undergraduate Student Research Conference held at the University of California, Irvine. This year's conference will be held on Saturday, March 6th, 2010.

Students at the conference give a 12 minute oral presentation to a small group of fellow honors students and will have the opportunity to have a 400 word abstract of their research published. Students also have the option of giving a poster presentation (see different format on the table below)

You can use class projects that are worthy of presenting on any topic you are covering in your classes. Research papers, oral histories, psychology research, creative production or performance, reflecting inquiry into the humanities, sciences, social sciences, art, and pre-professional careers.

This is a great opportunity for honor students and it will add a lot of weight on your transfer applications. Please see the formats allowed below:

- 1) Individual 12-minute presentation followed by 5 minutes of discussion
- 2) Small Group 20-minute panel presentation by two presenters, followed by 10 minutes of discussion
- 3) Large Group 40-minute panel of three or more participants, followed by 10 minutes of discussion
- 4) Poster Research posters displayed in the Pacific Ballroom in the Student Center
- 5) Performance Student-created art, music, creative writing, drama, dance
- 6) Issues Four selected panelists debate an assigned topic Forum

You will need to submit a brief proposal description and a 75-100 word summary for either an oral or a poster presentation to your professor or Club Advisor by December 5th, 2009.
