

Math 240, Fall 2011 (section 82596 MW 5:00-7:25pm) Syllabus Contract

I have read and understand the format of this course and the policies described in the syllabus. I understand that the course syllabus represents a binding agreement between the student and the instructor.

Specifically, I am aware of the following policies:

I will comply with the Regulations and Policies listed in the College of the Canyons Catalog (2010-11, pp. 239-253).

The use of mobile phones, pagers, laptops, or other electronic devices, such as iPods, is not allowed in the classroom. If my phone or pager disrupts class, I must immediately leave the classroom and will receive a full absence for that day. If my phone or pager disrupts an exam, I will receive a 10% penalty on that exam.

If I am disruptive or disrespectful, I must immediately leave the classroom and will receive a full absence for that day. If my behavior is continually disruptive or disrespectful or if I cheat on any quiz, exam or other written assignment, I will be immediately dismissed from class and must meet with the Vice President or Dean of Student Services before I am allowed to return to class. I also realize that I may be subject to dismissal from College of the Canyons.

I will be immediately dropped from the course if I miss more than the equivalent of two class sessions and do not discuss my absences with the instructor.

No late assignments of any form (class, journal, other) will be accepted.

If I am late for a quiz, I will not receive additional time to complete it. There are no makeup quizzes.

If I do not provide a valid ID on exam days, I will not be permitted to take the exam.

If I do not follow exam guidelines, I will receive a zero on that exam, which cannot be replaced with my grade on the final.

Exams will only be given on the scheduled dates and times specified in the "Schedule of Lectures" or in revisions announced during lecture. Makeup exams will not be given. Students with extreme circumstances must 1) leave a voice message at (661) 362-3038 or email the instructor prior to the scheduled exam and 2) provide official documentation by an outside authority (physician's letter, hospitalization or police report, etc.) for additional consideration.

For any grade disputes, I must submit the original graded assignment to the instructor within one week after the graded assignment is returned to me. Grade disputes submitted after the one week time period will not be considered.

The final exam will be held on Wednesday, December 7 from 5:00-7:00pm in Seco 204.

There is no extra credit available for this course.
