Campus Learning Programs, Resources, and Support Services

Admissions & Records	A&R processes admission applications, transcripts, petitions for graduation and certificates, enrollment verifications, pre-requisite challenges, and grades.
Cal WORKS	Cal WORKS services are for students who are parents and receive GAIN public assistance. Students receive advisement, support, and special opportunities.
Campus Safety	Campus safety maintains a safe and secure learning environment. It offers a campus escort shuttle service, escort service to and from the parking lots, and a lost & found.
Career Center	The Career Center offers career assessment, advisement, and job search workshops including resume writing and interviewing. It also provides job listings for Santa Clarita Valley and beyond.
Child Care	The Center for Early Childhood Education has 1/2 day and all day early childcare and education services for children of financially qualified students.
College Bookstore	The bookstore carries new and used textbooks as well as educational supplies and campus wear.
Community Extension Education	The Community Extension Office offers classes designed to meet community needs and interests. These classes meet for 3 - 6 hours for a nominal fee. The community is invited to take these courses just for fun.
Computer Labs	COC offers several computer labs for students throughout the campus. Students may use these computers with access to the Internet and Microsoft Office and other software.
Continuing Non-credit Education	The Community Extension Office offers non-credit courses such as English as a Second Language and Citizenship, Emeritus College courses for older adults and Health & Safety as Food Handlers Certification.
Cougar Mentors	Part of the Student Development Office, mentors offer Student Success Seminars and provide support and guidance to new students.
Counseling	Counseling provides educational, career, and personal counseling to students via consultations at the Drop-In Desk, private appointments, courses, and workshops.
CWEE	Cooperate Work Experience Education offers students the opportunity to earn elective units for on-the-job experience and internship opportunities.
DSPS	Disabled Students Program and Services provides services for students with disabilities in compliance with ADA and Section 504. DSPS has a Hi-Tech Center that offers adaptive access for students with disabilities, in addition to tutoring in selected subjects.
EOPS & Care	The Extended Opportunity Programs and Service (EOPS) provides support services to educationally disadvantaged students who did not graduate from high school or graduated with less than a 2.5 GPA, qualified for basic skills English and math courses at COC, and qualify for financial aid. It provides counseling, field trips, financial aid, and mentoring.

Educational Travel	Educational Travel provides students the opportunity to study abroad.
Financial Aid	The Financial Aid office provides financial aid services such as fee waivers, grants, scholarships, loans, and work-study to students found eligible through the FAFSA application and/or the BOG fee waiver application.
Health & Wellness	The Health & Wellness Center offers services to support physical and mental health. Access to a nurse practitioner, a nutritionist, a mental health counselor, health insurance, and family planning are available.
HITE & Honors	The High Intensity Transfer Enrichment (HITE) and Honors Programs are designed to challenge students to achieve their highest academic potential and to enhance their transcript for successful transfer to a four-year university.
ISP	The International Student Program provides services and support to international students attending COC on student visas.
Library	The COC Library provides students use of books, periodicals, research databases, study space, group study rooms, and reference assistance.
MESA	MESA is designed to help underrepresented, educationally and economically disadvantaged students transfer to four-year institutions in math, engineering and science majors by offering counseling, tutoring, academic excellence workshops, study space and group study rooms.
PACE	Progressive Adult College Education provides working adults the opportunity to take 2 courses every 8 weeks toward specific educational goals. Courses meet evenings & Saturdays.
Service Learning	Service learning integrates meaningful community service with instruction and reflection to enrich the learning experience, teach civic responsibility, and strengthen communities.
Student Business Office	The Student Business Office processes registration fees, parking fees, activity cards, library fines, transcripts & verifications, returned check fees, refunds upon student request, student account audits, distribution of payroll & financial aid checks.
Student Development	The Student Development Office provides leadership opportunities via the Associate Student Government and clubs. It issues students ID cards and also plans graduation and other on-campus activities.
The Zone	The Zone is a study and learning center for student athletes. It offers tutoring in many subjects on a walk-in basis at no charge.
TLC	The TLC offers tutoring in many subjects to enrolled COC students on a walk-in basis at no charge.
Transfer Center	Transfer Center provides resources such as college catalogs, applications, college representatives, and advisement to support transfer to 4 year universities
Veteran Services	Veteran Services certifies students to receive GI benefits for active duty, recently released from active duty, reserve, national guard, recently returning from deployment, recently deployed, and Dependants of service members with a service connected disability or deceased.
