Associate Degree in Nursing (RN) 2009-2010

A. NURSING PROGRAM PRE-REQUISITES

Pre-requisites are courses that a student must complete before the student can apply for admission to the Nursing Program. Each pre-requisite course must be completed with a “C” or better grade. However, the English Composition, Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology courses must also average to a **minimum 2.5 GPA**.

To earn an Associate Degree, students must achieve a minimum 2.0 GPA or better in the degree applicable units and be in good standing at COC. All courses for the major must be completed with a C or better grade.

Note to Students with Bachelor Degrees re: Senate Bill 1393

To obtain an associate degree in nursing, students who have earned a baccalaureate or higher degree, from a university accredited by a Regional Institution Accredited Organization, are only required to complete the course work required for completion of the registered nursing program, including prerequisites and nursing course work. These students are not required to complete any other courses required by the college for an associate degree. (Source: California Community College Chancellor's Office)

SELECTION PROCESS

STEP 1: Student completes Nursing Program Pre-requisite courses with a 2.5 GPA

STEP 2: Student submits the following documents to the Nursing Department Office: Nursing Program Application, H.S. transcript, HS Diploma, or GED Certificate Official sealed transcripts from every college attended.

STEP 3: Nursing Program completes a computerized "Scholastic Eligibility" check that considers:
GPA in Biology pre-requisite courses
How many times the student repeats classes
English GPA & Total GPA for all courses

STEP 4: Student takes the Nursing Assessment Test

STEP 5: Nursing Department Computer Program selects students at random for admission into Nursing

NURSING MAJOR COURSES (3 Options)

Students must complete every nursing major course with a "C" or better grade for a **minimum 2.0 GPA** in all the nursing major courses.
