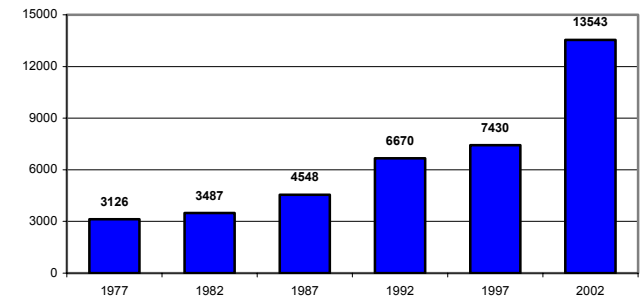

#### Total Fall Enrollment 1977-2002

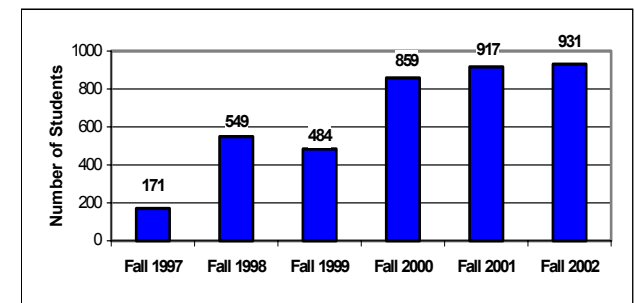

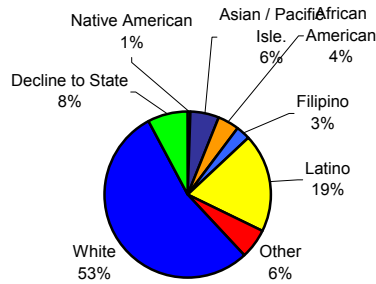

#### Concurrent Enrollment Trends: Fall 1997—Fall 2002



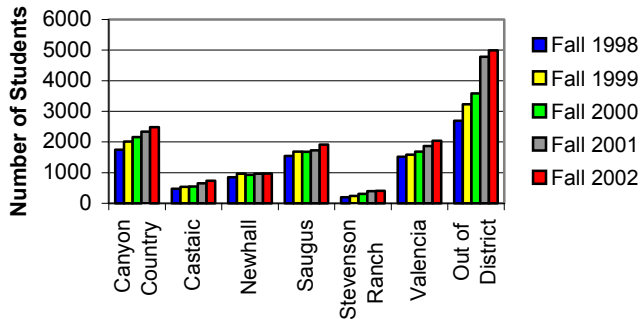

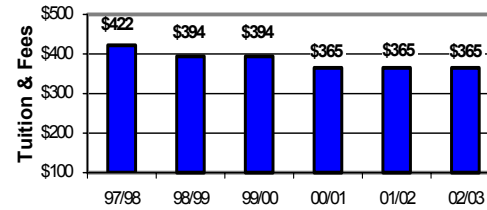

2001 / 02 Financial Awards: \$3,865,103 to 4,051 students

In compliance with the Student-Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-542), it is the policy of the Santa Clarita Community College District and College of the Canyons to make available its completion and transfer rates to all current and prospective students. Beginning in Fall 1998, a cohort of all certificate-, degree-, transfer-seeking, full-time, and first-time freshmen students were tracked over a three-year period. The figure below illustrates the College's completion and transfer rates compared to the State's rates for the same time period.

<u>Fall 1998 Cohort</u>	<u>COC</u>	<u>State</u>
<b>Transfer Rate</b>	50.0%	27.0%
<b>Completion Rate</b>	16.7%	30.6%

\*Note that these rates do not represent the success rates of the entire student population at COC as they exclude part-time students and students indicating "undecided" for their educational goal. Also, the rates also do not account for students graduating after this three-year tracking period. As mandated by PL 101-542.
