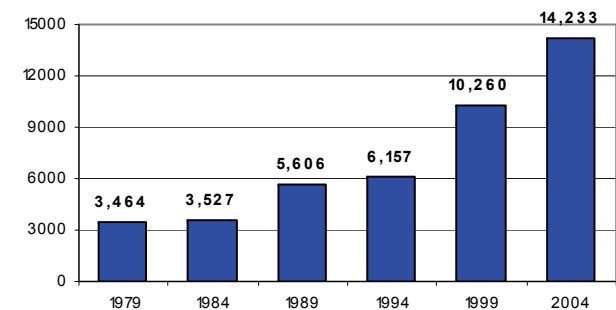

Total Fall Enrollment 1979-2004



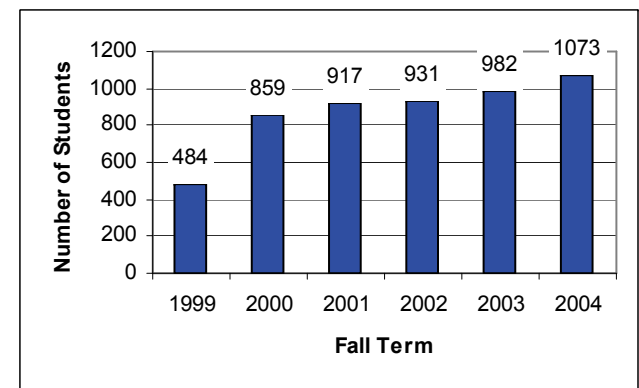

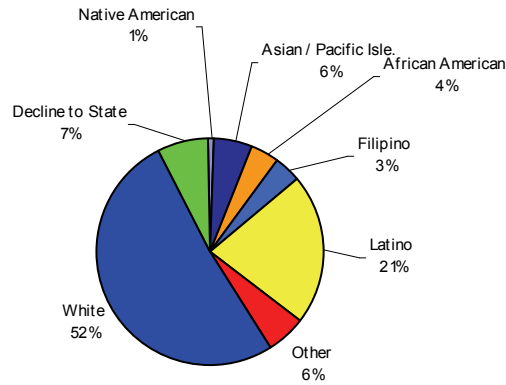

Concurrent Enrollment Trends: Fall 1999—Fall 2004



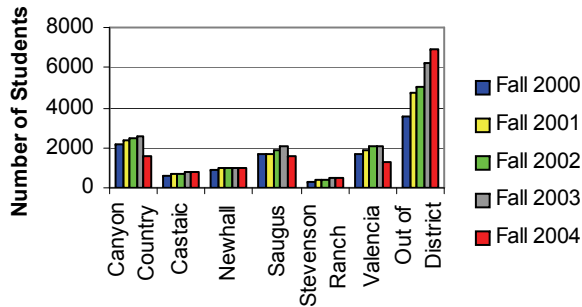
Student Demographics: Fall 2004

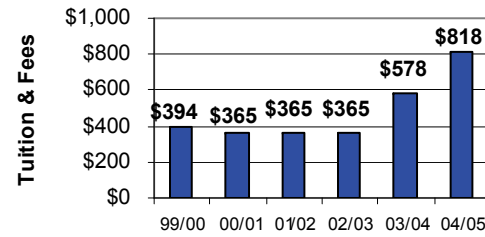

In compliance with the Student-Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990 (Public Law 101-542), it is the policy of the Santa Clarita Community College District and College of the Canyons to make available its completion and transfer rates to all current and prospective students. Beginning in Fall 2001, a cohort of all certificate-, degree-, transfer-seeking, full-time, and first-time freshmen students were tracked over a three-year period. The table below illustrates the College's completion and transfer rates compared to the State's rates for the same time period.
