Bachelor of Science in Child Development

Duration: Major is designed as a complete 4-year program however community college coursework in Early Childhood Education is fully transferable. Up to 84 community college units may be transferred towards the BS degree.

Costs: Tuition \$465 per unit; Academic Services Fee \$20 per course; Application Fee \$50; Grad Fee \$110.

Units: 128 semester units required to complete a Bachelor of Science degree. Of these hours:

- A minimum of 32 semester hours must be taken through University of La Verne.
- A minimum of 44 semester hours must be in upper-division courses.
- A minimum of 24 semester hours in upper-division courses must be taken in a major.

Estimated Courses: Approximately 42-43 courses. Will vary depending on prerequisite program requirements and courses the student will be transferring.
