

Distance Education Defined



AP 4105 (Distance Education) and Title V define DE as "...education that uses one or more technologies ...to deliver instruction to students who are separated from the instructor and to support regular and substantive interactions between students and the instructor , either synchronously or asynchronously ."

Title V: "A correspondence course is not distance education."

Distance Education and the College Mission

Distance Education: Historic Trends


Growth in Sections

FA06: 100% online sections = 3% of all credit sections


FA19: 100% online sections = 21% of all credit sections

Fill Rates: Semester-Length On-Ground, OnlineLIVE and Online Fall 2021




Fall Success Rates - Online Classes

Success means the percent of students who complete a class with a grade of C or better




Retention means the percent of students who complete a course


Fall Retention Rates - Online Classes








