


COC LEADS THE WAY

COC NUMBER 1 FOR ADULT LEARNERS IN COUNTY

COC was ranked among the best U.S. colleges in *Washington Monthly* magazine's ranking of *"Best Two-Year Colleges for Adult Learners."*

- Out of the ten California Community Colleges that made the list, COC ranks:
 - ✓ #1 in Los Angeles County,
 - ✓ #2 in Southern California, and
 - ✓ #53 nationally!
- Washington Monthly analyzed data from 978 colleges to create the top 100 two-year colleges in the nation for adult students (defined as students who are over the age of 25).
- At the time of the ranking, adult learners made up
 34% of COCs student population.
- Our Adult Reentry Program is a valuable resource for adult learners which helps new, returning, and continuing students who are 25 years of age and older.




