Nursing Graduates Make History!

The California Board of Registered Nursing (BRN) reported 1st quarter (July 1- Sept. 30) *first-time pass rates* to all nursing programs in the state.

Nursing programs are required by the BRN to maintain a 75% first-time pass rate, although students do have the ability to re-take the examination.

- For FY 2020-2021, COC Nursing topped **90**% first-time pass rate for the first time ever.
- For the recently reported first quarter, 40/42 COC graduates passed, at a rate of over 95%. This is the highest quarter first-time pass rate in COC history!
- These graduates (pictured in Fall 2019) benefitted from significant investments in simulation equipment and virtual simulation technology to supplement direct clinical experience (Including COVID-19 testing and vaccination) during the pandemic.







Student Services Chat Bot – Has Now Gone Live!

- Kelly Presented "What my diagnosis has TAUGHT me: a teacher's perspective" to a group of 250 attendees.








LatinX & Hispanic Heritage Cultural Festival

- We have changed our name, but not our purpose.
- INSPIRE Scholars exists to improve access to higher education for current/former foster and homeless youth; increase retention, graduation and transfer rates and promote student learning and development.





Grants Development Update

The College has secured \$4,587,932 in grant awards to-date for the 2020/2021 year, with many more ahead.

- Recent grants include support for student needs and STEM education including:
 - National Science Foundation S-STEM: \$1,493,379 over five years for student mentoring and scholarships in high need science programs (Patricia Foley)
 - Mathematics, Engineering, & Science Achievement (MESA): \$281,735 over three years for academic preparation, support, and student services. (Amy Foote)
 - NCAS NASA Community College Aerospace Scholars: \$50,000 over three years for training and a student support event (Teresa Ciardi)
- Director Amber Cole is coordinating a "Meet the Grant Makers" planned for November 10th in conjunction with the SCV Nonprofit Leadership Council as a virtual forum to bring funders and community non-profits and groups together. Funders and details to be announced online soon.
- ➤ **Upcoming opportunities** are anticipated in the areas such as advanced technology, apprenticeships, housing insecurity, technology, and student achievement as the office works closely with all areas of the college and many community partners.

Updates from the Canyon Country Campus

- > Instruction at CCC continues for Fall in 11 disciplines.
 - Administration of Justice, Astronomy, Automotive Technology, Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Early Childhood Education, Environmental Science, Geology, Mathematics, ESL, and Water Tech.
- Spring 2022 will bring an increase in in-person offerings with 156 class sections in 25 disciplines, including approximately 70 classes within the Takeda Science Center.

California's COVID-19 Tenant Relief Act and the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PAU)

Beginning October 1, 2021, the law requires any property owner wanting to evict a tenant for failing to pay rent to apply for rental assistance before proceeding with an eviction lawsuit. However, depending on your specific circumstances and where you live, there may be additional protections and requirements for both property owners and their tenants. Additionally, the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) federal assistance benefits ended September 4, 2021. Business owners, Self-employed workers, Independent contractors, People with a limited work history and many others are affected. Attend our upcoming Business Alliance meeting and hear from experts on the impacts of these moratoriums being lifted and the implications on those needing housing and employment.
