

MUSIC PROFESSOR NOMINATED FOR LATIN GRAMMY


COC music professor Yalil Guerra received a Latin Grammy nomination in the Best Classical Album category for his album "Cuba: The Legacy."


- Guerra has taught at COC for three years and shares his passion for music with his students.

 Vegas.








2019 CHAMPION OF HIGHER EDUCATION

The *COC Model United Nations (COCMUN)* team attended their first competition of the season on Saturday, October 5th at Santiago Canyon College.


- More than 130 delegates participated in the conference.

COC TO PARTICIPATE IN APPRENTICESHIP INITIATIVE

College of the Canyons has been selected to collaborate in the *U.S. Department of Labor Growing Advanced Manufacturing Apprentices Across America (GAMAAA) Program.*

- ➤ This program will prepare and place **5,000** workers into pre-apprenticeship and apprenticeship roles.
- Led by West L.A. College and the South Bay Workforce Investment Board, the program was funded by a \$12 million grant from the U.S. Department of Labor to support expanding registered apprenticeship in advanced manufacturing, primarily in the aerospace and bioscience industries.
- This award propels COC on to the national stage in the conversation regarding apprenticeships.
- ➤ This collaboration between colleges from different regions is historic and will become a pilot for encouraging similar partnerships among the 115 California Community Colleges.

SCV EDC & CALARTS HOST PUBLIC OFFICIALS NIGHT


The SCVEDC and CalArts hosted a Public Officials Night on Thursday, October 3rd at CalArts.

- Ms. Brill and Dr. Claudia Acosta helped to identify students to come in and share their stories with Congresswoman Hill.

UPCOMING PRT

In two weeks we will host our 2nd PRT. This team, led by Dr. Gil Stork, retired CEO from Cuesta College, will help us identify ways that we can get better.

Specifically, it will focus on allowing us to:

- Design and develop a framework to integrate in-reach and outreach into district-wide operations and functions on campus;
- Develop a process and infrastructure that invites and generates input and feedback that initiates messaging to expand partnerships and opportunities to engage student workplace learning opportunities and public and private initiatives;

UPCOMING PRT

- > Strategically advance our outreach efforts to increase enrollment of concurrently enrolled students, as well as those who are working to achieve degrees and certificates to meet industry standards and competitiveness while working full-time;
- Design and further develop a college and career going culture within our local elementary, junior high and high schools to provide clear guidance as it relates to *Pathways* and 2+2 *Opportunities* for our district to expand concurrent enrollment opportunities; and
- Develop activities that promote communication and understanding of the roles played by people on campus to build strong communication between disciplines/offices, programs and our two growing campuses.

UPCOMING PRT

In anticipation of this second visit of the team in November, college committee members are being asked to evaluate the "who", the "how", and the "what" that is missing in their functioning, with a special emphasis on how they communicate about the work that they do; how others can get involved; and how they can focus the work so it supports the other parts of the committee structure.

This will not only be used to improve how we function, but will help to eliminate duplication, enhance cooperation, solicit input across silos and engage more members of the campus community.

As a part of our work with the PRT, we will be securing external professional assistance to develop a tool that will help us clarify how many people know about how the groups, departments, and committees on campus work together,(all which can be improved); how they see their role; as well as identify ways that communication, structure and inclusion will be enhanced in our planning and decision making processes.


