



#### FIRST YEAR PROMISE GRANT RECEIVED BY COC

College of the Canyons received a \$667,000 grant for First Year Promise Program!

- Out of 51 community college districts that applied, COC was one of only 14 colleges awarded a CCCCO grant through the California Community Promise Innovation Grant Program.
- The First Year Promise program is scheduled to launch this fall with 300 qualifying students.
- Eligible incoming students will enroll in a one-year sequence of courses with priority registration, preceded by summer orientation to learn about majors and receive academic guidance.
- First Year Promise courses will be offered with the benefits of OER textbooks.
- > To ensure participating students remain on track, ongoing counseling and student support will also be offered.
- Each of these students will receive a \$100 voucher per semester that can be applied toward other supplies and instructional materials. Free printing services will also be provided in the computer lab.

## COC STUDENTS PRESENT AT THE HONORS TRANSFER COUNCIL OF CA (HTCC)

Three students from College of the Canyons have been accepted to the Honors Transfer Council of California 17<sup>th</sup> Annual Research Conference.

- Over 300 students from 31 California Community Colleges will be presenting their research at UC Irvine on Saturday, April 1st.
- > This annual research conference gives students in community college honors programs the opportunity to present the results of their work.
- Presenting at the conference makes the student eligible for monetary awards, as well as a chance to submit their work for publication in the HTCC anthology "Building Bridges" published through UC Irvine.
- The COC students faced a very competitive application process and their abstracts were judged to be superior!

#### COC STUDENT PUBLISHED IN "THE ASTRONOMICAL JOURNAL"!

In 2015 Professor Teresa Ciardi introduced COC student Mindy Saylors to Dr. David Ciardi at Caltech where she worked as a paid summer research student for 4 months.

- As part of the world-wide effort to confirm and characterize the thousands of exoplanet candidates discovered by NASAs Kepler Mission, thousands of high resolution imaging observations were obtain at some of the world's largest telescopes including the Hale Telescope at Palomar Observatory, just east of San Diego.
- Under the mentorship of Dr. Ciardi, Mindy Saylors worked and went to the telescope, operated the infrared camera that collected hundreds of images, processed the data and analyzed the results.
- Ms. Saylor's work contributed directly to the overall effort of NASAs Kepler Planetary Candidate Follow-Up Observation Program and resulted in two referenced publications in "The Astronomical Journal".
- Congratulations to former COC student Mindy Saylor who has transferred to UC Irvine as an engineering student.



#### CARE SCV – FEBRUARY 25

The inaugural College of the Canyons "CARE SCV: Cancer Awareness & Resource Expo, took place in the PAC on February 25<sup>th</sup>.

- > The brainchild of biology instructor Dr. Kelly Cude, drew a crowd of approximately **500** people.
- The event was sponsored by Henry Mayo Newhall Hospital and supported by organizations including the American Cancel Society, City of Hope Santa Clarita, Providence Holy Cross Medical Center, Santa Clarita Radiation Therapy Center and UCLA Health.
- > The daylong fair featured a variety of speakers, displays, activities (including a giant colon and lung) and information.














## DELTA KAPPA GAMMA INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY ANNUAL SPRING FESTIVAL – MARCH 11

### LEON MALMED VISITED COC – FEBRUARY 14 & 15

Leon Malmed, Holocaust survivor and author, visited COC on February 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>.

- On Tuesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> Mr. Malmed worked with Jeff Baker, Masha Vasilkovsky and guest cinematographer Ruah Edelstein in creating the third in a series of animated documentaries in conjunction with the non-profit "Remember Us: Righteous Conversation project". This project records and documents the stories of the last survivors of the Holocaust.
- More information on the documentary will be presented at the March 22<sup>nd</sup> Joint Meeting with ASG.
- The two previous films created at the college were "When Man to Man is a Wolf" and Marie Kaufman "C'est Normal". Both of these films have been shown at various festivals and locations including the LA Museum of the Holocaust.
- Following the filming there was a reception and talk about Cultural Diversity with the Advancement Team and EEO Advisory Committee in the Art Galley.
- On Wednesday, February 15<sup>th</sup> Mr. Malmed visited a Political Science class and then in the evening spoke to the college and community about this escape from the Holocaust in occupied France.










OLC COLLABORATIVE – FEBRUARY 16

- > The one-day conference was held in San Francisco and had over 200 attendees.
- Most of the attendees were from the CSU system, with some Community College representatives.
- In a keynote address I was honored to share our success so far with Online Educational Resources (OER) and made the case that California higher education systems would be wise to understand OER is a game changer in linking students, affordability, expanded access and increased completion.





#### CIVIC ENGAGEMENT - MAKING AN IMPACT - FEBRUARY 17-19

**Dr. Patty Robinson**, Faculty Director of the Civic and Community Engagement Initiatives, and **Robert Wonser**, Assistant Professor of Sociology, attended the IMPACT Conference at Washington University in St. Louis in February.

- The conference is historically the largest annual conference focused on civic engagement of college students in community service, service learning, community-based research, advocacy and other forms of social action.

### **#YouAreWelcomeHere - MARCH 1**



more than 20 countries.






#### **IMMERSIVE CLASSROOM – MARCH 2**






## **DELIBERATIVE DIALOGUE – MARCH 3**

- Deliberative Dialogues are premised upon the recognition of strengths in other peoples' positions, showing concern for others, temporarily suspending one's own beliefs, searching for a common understanding and relying on the participant's collective knowledge and experiences to arrive at better solutions.

- > Look at campus plants up close using a microscope






#### SULPHUR SPRING STEAM EXPO – MARCH 28

- Once this plan is submitted, COC will be eligible to receive a grant of up to \$200,000 to implement the plan.
