# **HONOR STUDENTS - FALL 2017**

Each semester I am pleased to send out congratulations letters to students who earn a 3.5 or better GPA while maintaining 12 or more units.

- 1,623 students earned this honor in fall 2017, up almost 13% from fall 2016.
- This included 93 First Year Promise students and 75 international students!
- Additionally, 26 (10%) of the 262 students in the First Year Promise Program, earned a perfect 4.0.

# INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AT COC

Our **200** international students continue to shine at COC!

- > 38 of our international students earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in fall 2017, up from 29 in fall 2016.
- > **75** of our international students earned a GPA of 3.5 or above in fall 2017, up from **64** in fall 2016.
- > **34** of our international students transferred to a 4-year university in 2017!
- Two students from China, who "couldn't do math" in their own country are now majoring in math! Kudo's to our excellent math professors!
- Our international students come from 44 countries and speak 22 languages!

- Daytime performances are held as part of the Santa Clarita Ballet Company outreach program to inspire others to appreciate and pursue the arts.











#### **GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY AT CCC – JANUARY 24**

Just before the meeting today we celebrated the official groundbreaking of the Canyon Country Campus Science Center.

- The 55,000 square foot building will bring in-demand science laboratory and classroom space to the heart of the campus and effectively double the existing building space on campus.
- > The center will house eight labs serving students studying zoology, botany, marine biology, microbiology, anatomy and physiology, physics, environmental science, astronomy and chemistry.
- ▶ It will also include a cadaver lab, a 75-student lecture hall, faculty offices and a computer lab.
- These new, state-of-the-art learning spaces will enable the college to meet the growing enrollment at the Canyon Country Campus, which has exceeded projections every year since it opened in 2007.

COC will host College 2 Career Day on Saturday, January 27<sup>th</sup> from 9 am – 1 pm in the University Center.

- The workshop is being held in partnership with the SCV Senior Center.




#### CREATING A POSITIVE CLIMATE IN THE WORKPLACE & MEETINGS
