
Chancellor's Report and Update

On Friday, June 14th we were proud to honor our Noncredit Graduates.

We had 394 graduates, including certificate earners for all of our programs, as well as students who earned their GED.

BOT Chancellor's Report

CANYONS PROMISE ACCEPTS OVER 700 FOR 2019/20 COHORT

COC is pleased to admit **732** students for the **2019/2020 College Promise cohort**!

- The program, previously know as First-Year Promise, received **1,242** applications, a **151%** increase since its launch in 2017!
- Along with waived tuition and fees, students also benefit from priority registration privileges, a \$100 voucher per semester that can be applied toward textbooks, supplies and instructional materials, access to a parking pass or city bus pass, and free computer lab printing services.
- Courses are offered with the benefit of Zero Textbook Cost materials, peer mentors, counseling and student support throughout the year.
- > Students who maintain eligibility the first year will be eligible for waived tuition and fees for their second year.
- > A Welcome Day event is planned for Friday, August 9th.








COC GOES TO SACRAMENTO

COC has spent a lot of time advocating in Sacramento with our fellow community colleges over the past several months!

- On 6/19/19 we joined our colleagues in advocating at the Senate Education Committee hearing on AB720, the ISA FTES bill.
- The bill passed out of the Senate Education Committee and was held in suspense by the Senate Appropriations Committee.
- We continue to advocate on behalf of our students.



SCFF OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETING

On Monday, June 17th I participated in the *Student Centered Funding Formula (SCFF) Oversight Committee* meeting at Santa Monica College.

- The committee consists of **12** members appointed by either the Governor, the Speaker of the State Assembly, or the Senate Committee on Rules.
- At the meeting we:
 - ✓ Reviewed and discussed equity definitions and decided on a definition to use to frame the work of the committee.
 - ✓ Heard from other SCFF advisory groups, who shared their recommendations for changes to the SCFF.
 - ✓ Received presentations from the two subcommittees (*First-Generation College Students and Incoming Academic Proficiency*) on their emerging recommendations.
 - ✓ Discussed next steps.
- Our next meeting will be on September 4th.





BPC TASK FORCE ON HIGHER EDUCATION

On Tuesday, June 18th I participated via phone in the *Bipartisan Policy Center (BPC)Task Force on Higher Education*.

BIPARTISAN POLICY CENTER

- The meeting focused on:
 - ✓ Federal-State Partnerships;
 - ✓ Federal Accountability and Quality Assurance;
 - ✓ Reforms to the Federal Financial Aid System;
 - ✓ FAFSA Reform; and
 - ✓ Reforming the School Closure Process.
- ➤ It is an honor to participate in this committee, co-chaired by the Honorable Howard P. Buck McKeon and the Honorable George Miller, to rethink the federal and state roles in higher education with the goal of better-promoting affordability and accountability throughout the system.





CEOCCC BOARD MEETING

On Friday, June 21st I participated via phone in the *CEOCCC Board meeting*.


- The meeting focused on:
 - ✓ A state budget update;
 - ✓ Bills of Interest;
 - ✓ Federal Issues including:
 - Higher Education Act;
 - Strengthening Community Colleges Training Grants;
 - o Increase of maximum Pell;
 - Increases in federal work-study and supplemental education opportunity grants; and
 - New funding for registered apprenticeships.
 - New Accreditation Rules to be finalized by November 1st and implemented in 2020.
 - ✓ Resolution Against Lobbying for Special Appropriations from Proposition 98;
 - ✓ DSPS Allocation Formula Update; and
 - ✓ Affordability, Food and Housing Access Task Force Update.
- We also received an update on CCLC operations, and the CCCT Endorsement Timeline for 2020 ACCT Election and 2019 Candidates.



CEO SCFF TASKFORCE CONFERENCE CALL

PATHWAYS PARTNERSHIP CREATED WITH THE HART DISTRICT

To help prepare students for transfer or for career technical education, COC and the William S. Hart Union High School District have created a partnership that will offer 8 college classes at high school campuses during the regular school day.

- The **College and Career Access Pathways (CCAP) Partnership** will allow **180** Hart District students to enroll in up to a maximum of **5** units per term and will provide all course materials, including books and equipment necessary for course completion.
- ➤ The first class, offered during spring 2019, was at Valencia High School in Administration of Justice 101.
- With the opening of Castaic High School in fall 2019, we plan to offer over 10 classes per semester during the 2019/20 academic year.

 - ✓ Manufacturing Technology 090 Saugus High School





GOOGLE IT PROFESSIONAL: LUNCH N' LEARN

The Economic Development Division hosted the first *Lunch n' Learn* for the *Google IT Professional* cohort on June 26th.

- Jeremy Stepan, President of Resurgence IT, spoke with 18 participants of the Google IT Professional cohort on current IT trends, the value of certifications and how they can gain a competitive advantage.
- ➤ The Google IT Professional program is comprised of COC students, veterans, incumbent workers and job seekers.

READY TO WORK ACADEMY

We are pleased to announce the launch of the *Ready to Work Academy at COC* for 7 students from Carousel Ranch.

- Certificate-based courses in a variety of subjects, including "Workplace Skills in Customer Service for Retail, Food Service and Hospitality" will be offered to young adults with special needs.
- ➤ This pilot class, along with two other in the fall, were funded through a grant from Supervisor Kathryn Barger.

> COC plans to continue to develop partnerships to offer short-term training suited for students with special needs, providing vocational training in specific job categories with the goal of job placement for candidates who enroll in the program.



VISIT BY TAIWANESE STUDENTS

We were please to welcome our first organized Taiwanese delegation since 2014 for a 10-day visit in July. The delegation was the result of 2 ½ years of partnership building and a grant from the Ministry of Education in Taiwan.

- ➤ The delegation, from **5** high schools, included **5** administrators/ teachers and **7** students.
- During their visit they planned with the ISP team to expand partner schools in Taiwan and China, met with COC administrators, observed COC classes, as well as participating in the 4th of July parade and taking a tour of Remo Drums.
- One student from the group will be starting at COC this fall, and 2 students will be starting in fall 2020.
- ➤ The principal who accompanied the group talked about his experiences at COC and why he thinks COC is the best choice for Taiwanese students.
- ➤ I was delighted to meet with the students as they visited my office during their campus tour.









IE² ANNUAL RETREAT

Over **50** people attended the annual *IE*² *Retreat* on Friday, June 28th.

- Attendees participated in interactive activities facilitated by the English Department Chair, *Alene Terzian*, that focused on:
 - ✓ Acknowledging the *Bright Spots* and identifying things that can cause

 - ✓ Discussing the importance of clear communication around Canyons Completes efforts.


