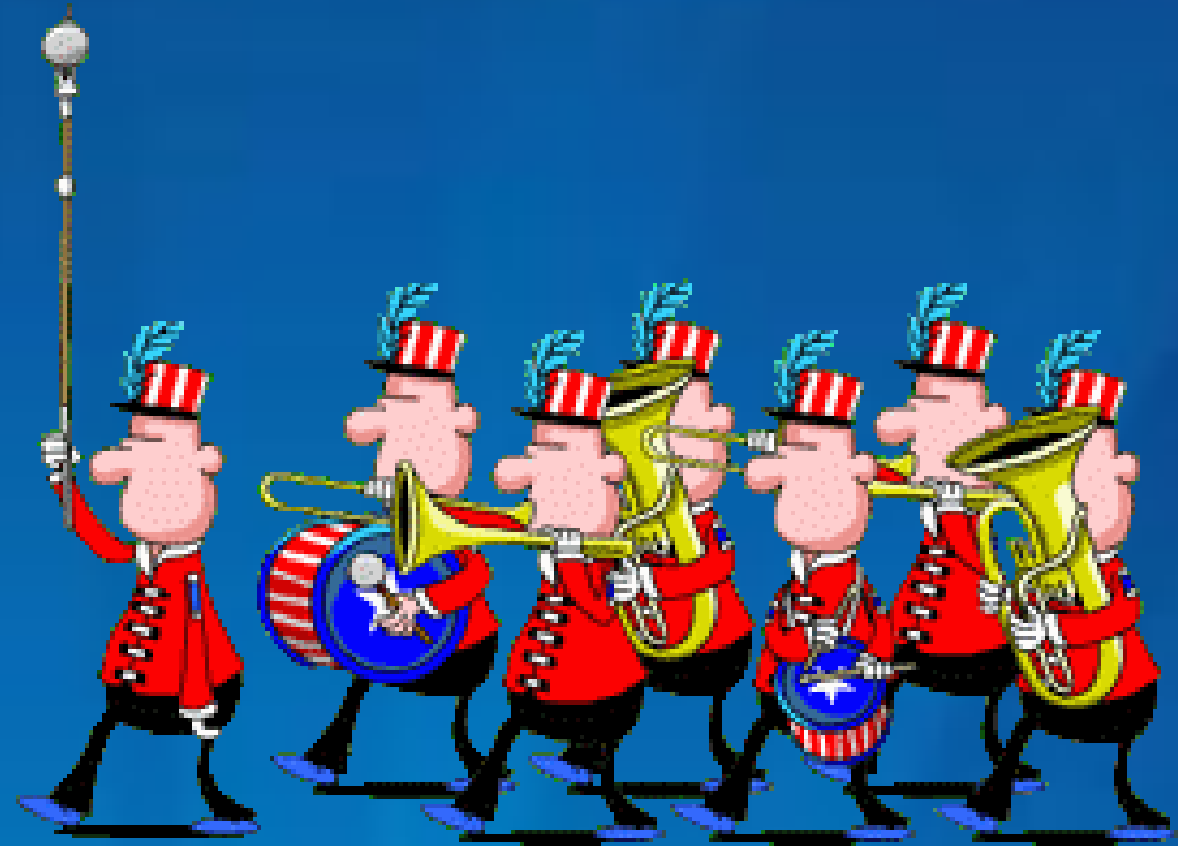

# NURSING PATHWAYS TO BSN

Our nursing program is experiencing a cultural shift as it relates to pursuing higher education.

- In 2014-15 only **14%** of our graduates pursued higher education with concurrent enrollment or within 6 months of graduation.
- That number has exploded in 2017-18 to **95.5%** due to dual enrollment, including the BSN program currently offered in the University Center.
- In fact, in Spring 2018 we had **50%** of our students concurrently enrolled in an ADN/BSN program.
- Congratulations to the entire nursing faculty for encouraging our students to excel.



# DR. KELLY CUDE DANCES FOR CHARITY

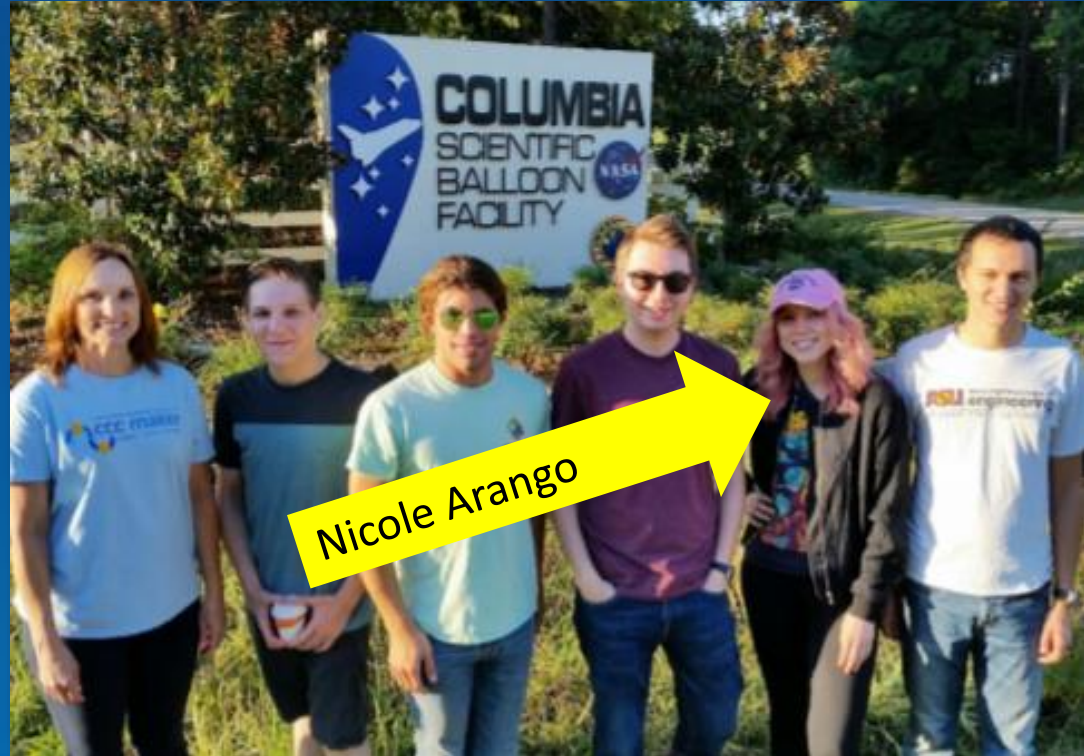
- Kelly personally raised **\$6,735** and her American Cancer Society team raised **\$40,800** since June 1!

- Prior to Nicole, current COC student Patrick Gagnon and COC graduate Mindy Saylor (now at UC Irvine) were included as authors on scientific papers.

# CHRIS COTA NAMED MANAGER OF NEW FRANCHISE

Congratulations to COC head baseball coach *Chris Cota* on being named manager of the new *West Coast League (WCL) team* based in Ridgefield, Washington.

- The WCL is considered the premier summer collegiate baseball league west of the Mississippi River.
- Chris has served as head coach of the Cougars since 2000 and served as assistant coach under Len Mohny prior to being named head coach.
- Chris played on the *1986 California Community College Athletic Association State Cougar Championship* team and was drafted and signed by the Chicago White Sox and the California Angels.
- We are very proud of Chris as he takes on this additional role during his summer break at COC (beginning in June 2019) to develop and mentor collegiate baseball athletes.



# COC STUDENTS RECOGNIZED WITH TOP HONORS

More than **2,800** of America's best and brightest college students traveled to Baltimore over the summer break to showcase their talents at the *Future Business Leaders of America – Phi Beta Lambda National Leadership Conference*.

- The COC FBLA-PBL chapter was presented with the *Gold Seal Chapter Award of Merit* for promoting programs and projects of FBLA-PBL.

# UP, UP AND AWAY!

For the third consecutive year a COC team participated in **NASA's High Altitude Student Platform (HASP)** scientific research flight.

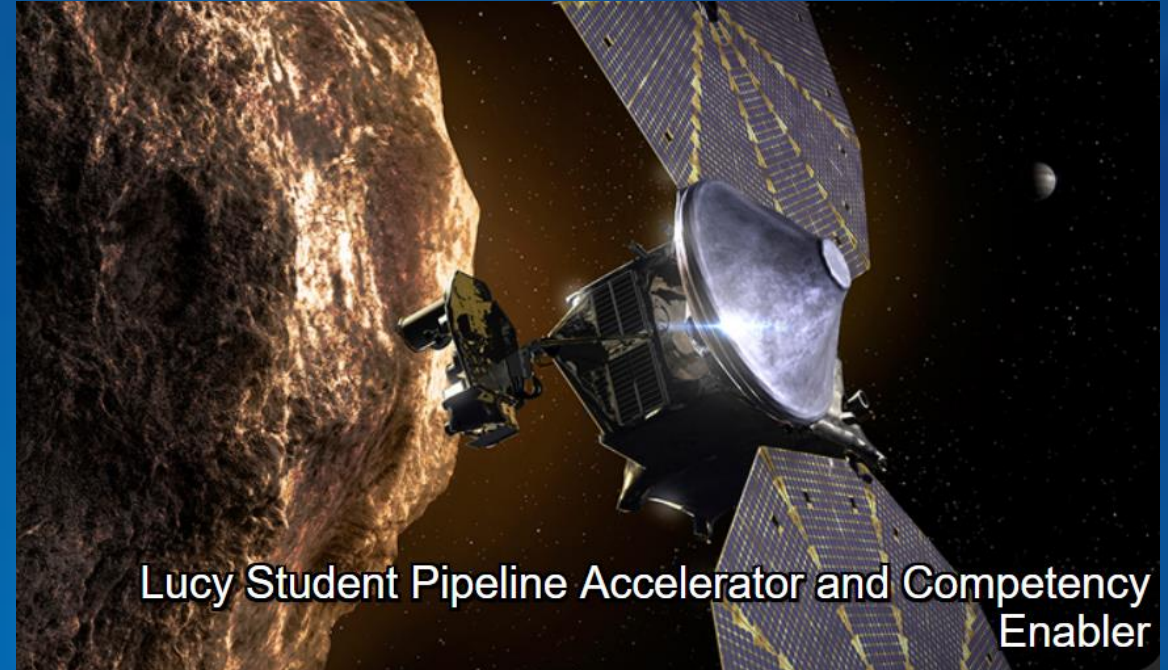
- COC students **Patrick Gagnon** and **Hunter Napier** were on-site in Fort Sumner, New Mexico to successfully add the neutralizing solution into the chamber of our payload and complete final pre-launch testing.
- Following a delay due to high winds, the flight successfully launched from New Mexico on September 4<sup>th</sup>, with Patrick and Hunter sending our payload commands remotely from COC.
- The goal of the experiment was to curb the amount of “harmful acids” in the stratosphere using a water-like solution.
- College of the Canyons is the only community college to have flown more than once and one of just four community colleges to have participated in the history of the program.
- Congratulations to **Professor Teresa Ciardi** and her students for representing COC so well!



# COC STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN NASA PROGRAM

Two *Astronomy & Physics Club* students were selected to participate in the *Lucy Student Pipeline Accelerator and Competency Enabler (L'SPACE) Virtual Academy*.

- *Hunter Napier* and *Arthur Berberyan* will participate in a 12-week program designed to engage a diverse population of college/university science and engineering students in rigorous, project-based STEM workforce development.
- This academy supports *NASA's Lucy Mission to Jupiter's Trojan Asteroids*, which will be the first mission to explore a population of small bodies believed to be fossil remnants of the early solar system.



# COC STUDENT RECEIVES NASA INTERNSHIP

Congratulations to COC student *Patrick Gagnon* on securing a *NASA Community College Aerospace Scholarship*.

- This program gives community college STEM students an authentic NASA experience and encourages them to finish a two-year degree or transfer to a four-year university to pursue a NASA-related field or career.
- Patrick has been assigned to the Stennis Space Center in Mississippi, where he will participate in a four-day engineering workshop alongside NASA scientists and engineers.

- Board of Governors members **Hildy Aguinaldo** and **Jolena M. Grande** also participated in the summit.

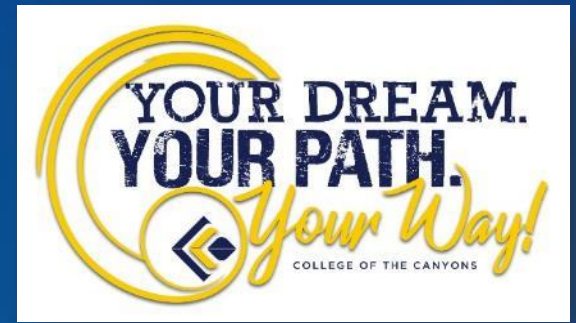




# YOUR DREAM, YOUR PATH, YOUR WAY!

- The talented students in the on-campus club ***Ballet Folklorica Tesoro***, under the direction of advisor Lucy Medina, performed for the audience.

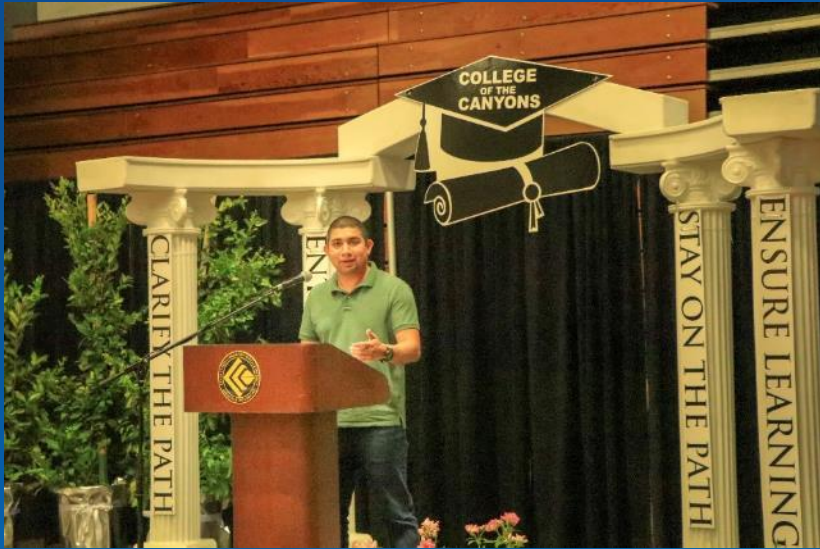


# YOUR DREAM, YOUR PATH, YOUR WAY!

# ISP OFF TO A RUNNING START!

International Services and Programs (ISP) welcomed a new cohort of **72 students** from **21 countries** this fall.

- During the summer, ISP had the largest summer registration with **98 students**, **53** who achieved a GPA of 3.5 or higher.
- Our Chinese-speaking population has grown from **3** in Spring 2015 to **67** this Fall (with 8 of those students from Taiwan).
- We have **15** Japanese students, many of them on COC athletic teams.
- For the 2018 calendar year, ISP welcomed a total of **115** new students to COC, about the same number as the total ISP population in Spring 2014.
- We are proud to continue our global diversity by having students from **51** countries on our campus this semester!
- The ISP staff is doing an amazing job in their recruitment efforts with partnerships in China, Taiwan and Japan.

- Pearl Hsiung’s painting and video works explore states of physical, psychical and metaphysical metamorphosis.



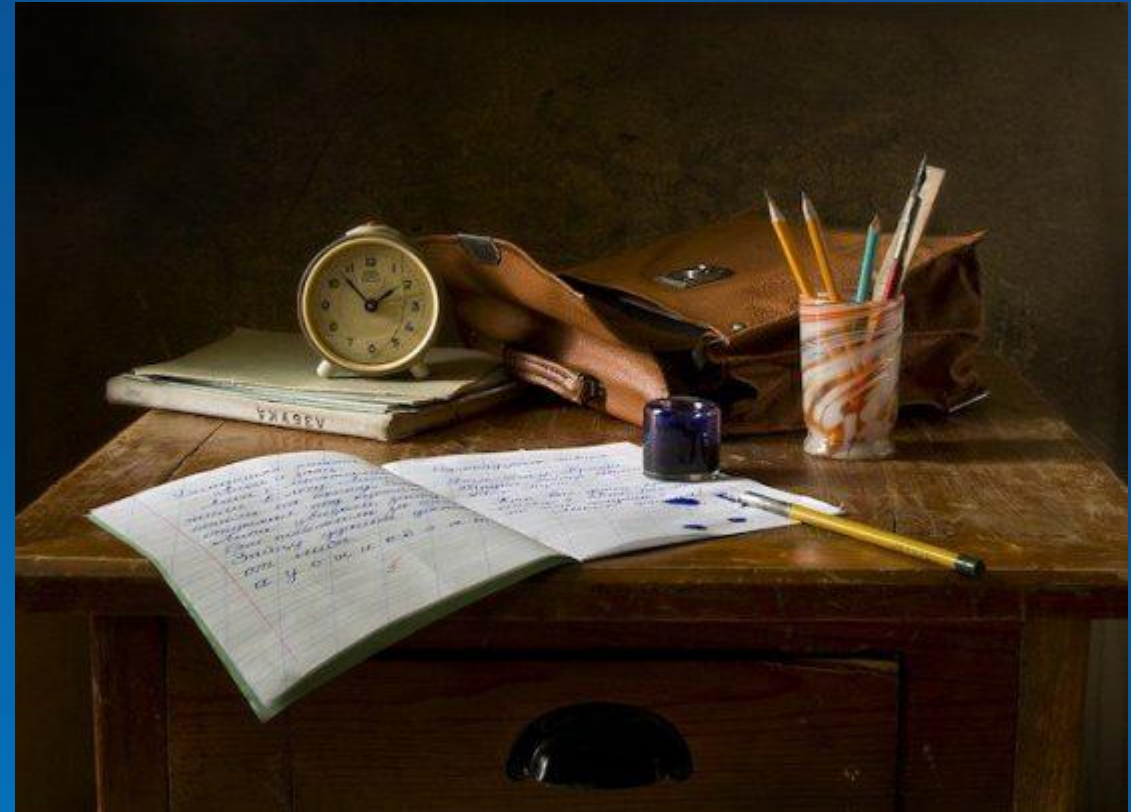

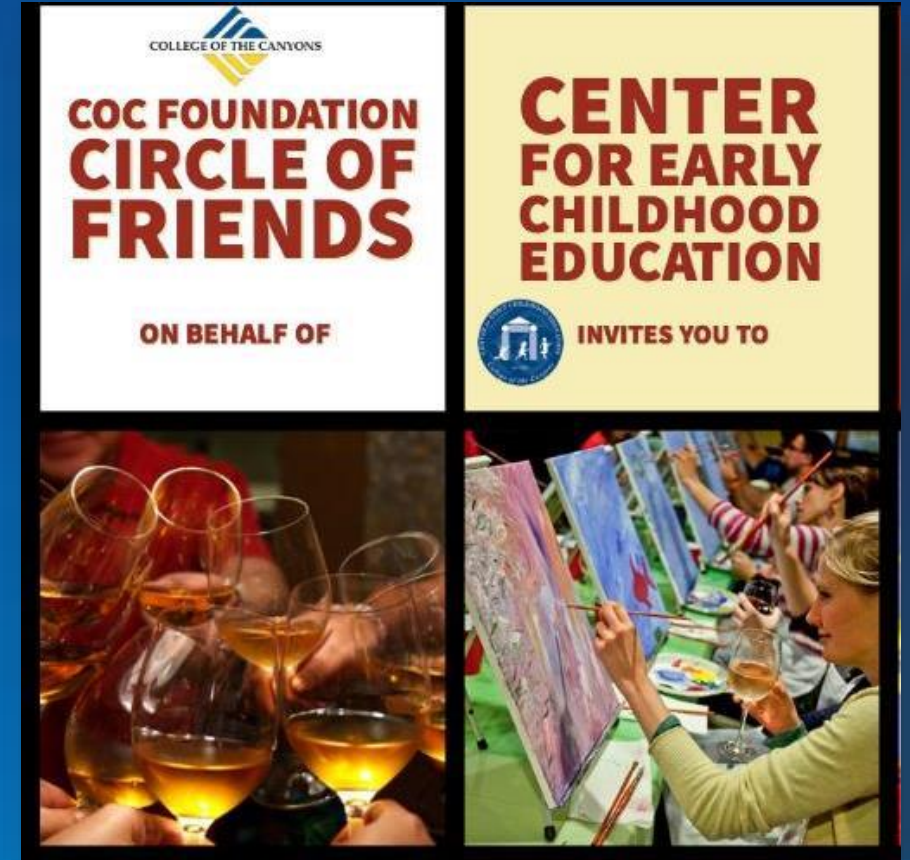

- The cost is \$35 per painter and participants will be painting the bright colors of fall.



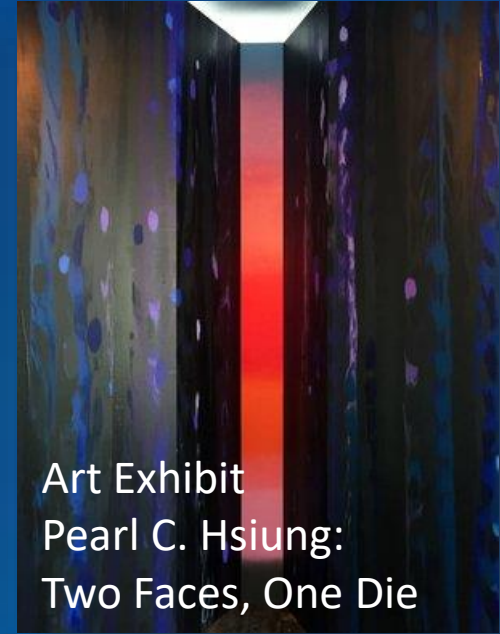
# COC TO HOST SCV TRUSTEES ASSOCIATION

# COMMERCIAL DRONE EXAM PRE AND TRAINING

COC Community Education is offering a Commercial Drone Pilot Exam Prep and Training course on Tuesdays from September 25 through November 6, 2018.

- Experts speculate that by the year 2020 there will be over **23 million** drones in service and based on the current aircraft to pilot ratio and the FAA requirement of one pilot per drone, there will be a need for **650,000** additional commercial drone pilots.
- This course will prepare students to pass the FAA part 107 ***Remote Pilot in Command (RPIC)*** exam and receive their ***RPIC certification***.
- The course, which costs \$399, will cover:
  - ✓ Regulations;
  - ✓ National Airspace;
  - ✓ Aircraft Performance; and
  - ✓ Operations and Weather.
