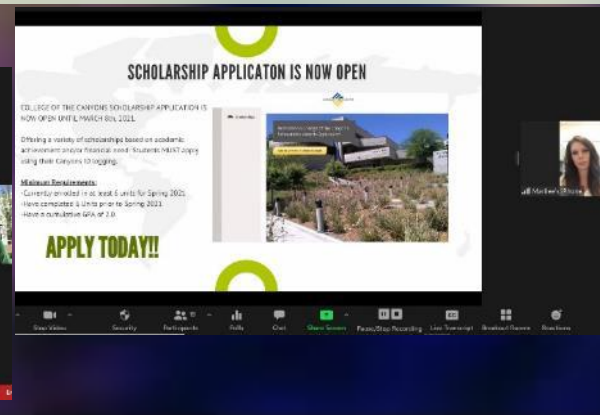
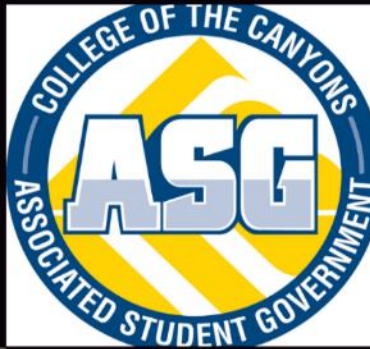
- Additional drive-thru events occurred **February 23rd**, **March 2nd** and **9th** with the final two occurring on **March 16th** and **23rd**.

To **Engage, Encourage, Empower, Equip, and Enrich** students and the campus community.

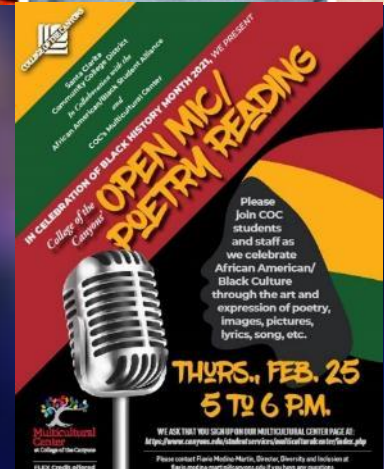
To **expand learning** through civil discourse, engaged listening, personal growth, and discovery.

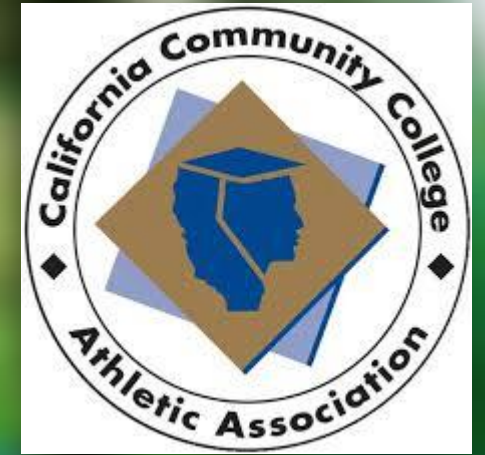

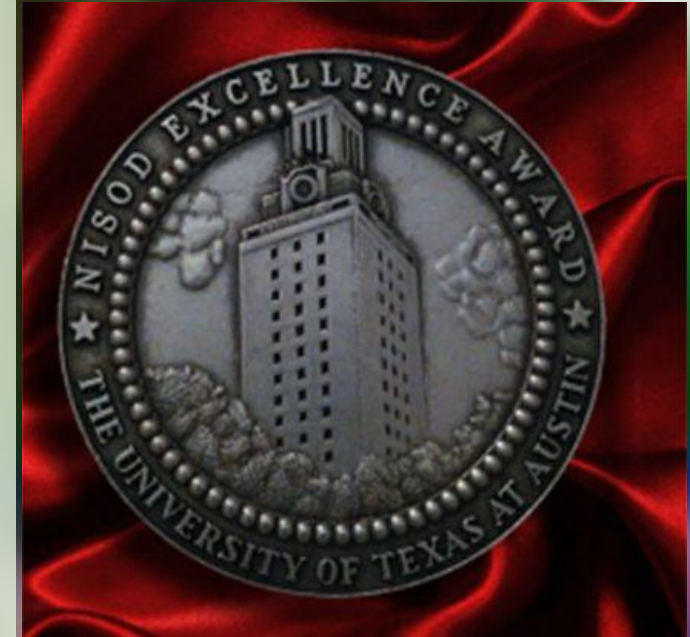

Dr. Omar Torres and I visited the COC Machine Shop on March 9th to sign the 2021 NASA RockSatX Payload for our student team. Adjunct Machining Faculty **Gregory Poteat** and Professor **Teresa Ciardi** planned a *hands-on* task for us – we drilled and tapped the **2 final holes** in the payload deck that will be mounted to the rocket!

- The student team are in the final phase of integrating electrical and mechanical systems and testing.
- The RockSatX rocket will launch in **August**, carrying several university team experiments and our COC **Auto-Rotation Descent** vehicle experiment.

The students are also supported by counselors, support services, and a community of students who are also going through their first year of college.



TLC Reopening by Appointment for Student Quiet Space

Based on feedback provided by our students, and in accordance with *LA County Department of Public Health* guidelines, we are now able to open up **quiet space** for students to study and use computers in **TLC**, beginning **Monday, March 22, 2021**.

- County guidelines necessitate that this space can only be opened up to **25% total capacity**, so staff will be able to serve **59 students** at a time.
- Students will have an opportunity to sign-up for two hour shifts as follows:
 - **Mondays through Thursdays:** 10 am – noon, 12:30 pm – 2:30 pm, 3:00 pm – 5:00 pm, and 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm
 - **Fridays:** 10 am – noon and 1:00 pm – 3:00 pm
- Prior to arrival, students will be required to fill out their **health log** as well as **temperature check-in**.
- **Special gratitude** is extended to our **ASG** for bringing this student need to the attention of administration, and thanks to **Instruction, Facilities, IT, Student Services, Business Services, and Human Resources** for making this possibility a reality for our students!

- Terri comes to us with a wealth of experience from CSUN, Bakersfield CC, and many more colleges and universities. She is excited to join our team.

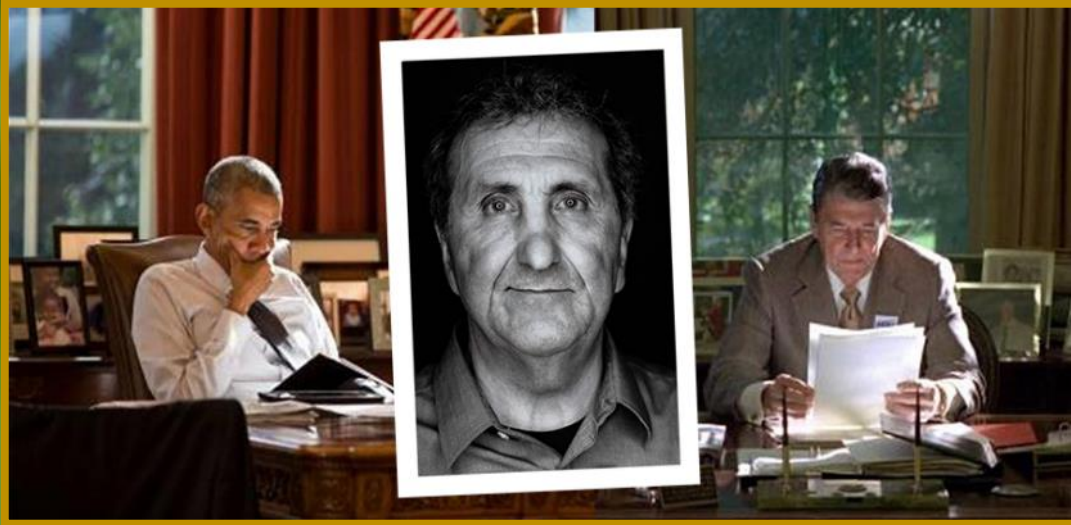
Dream Resource Center

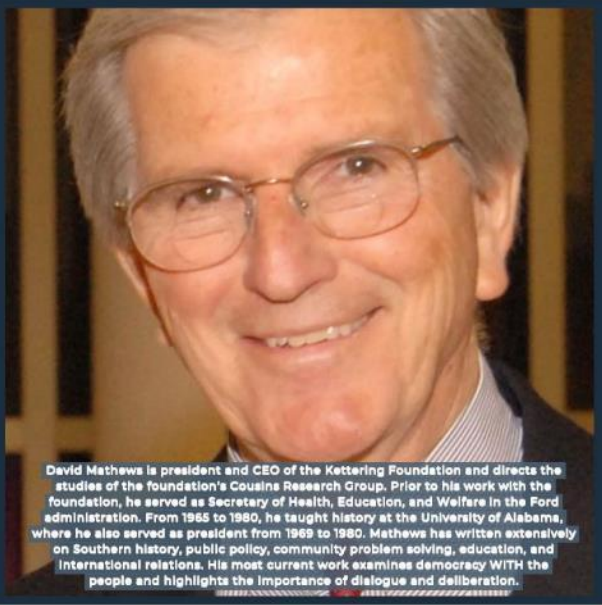

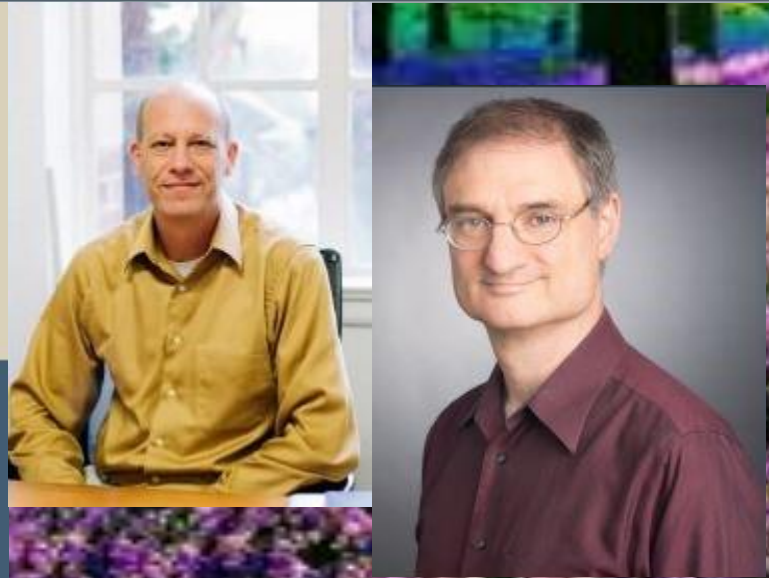

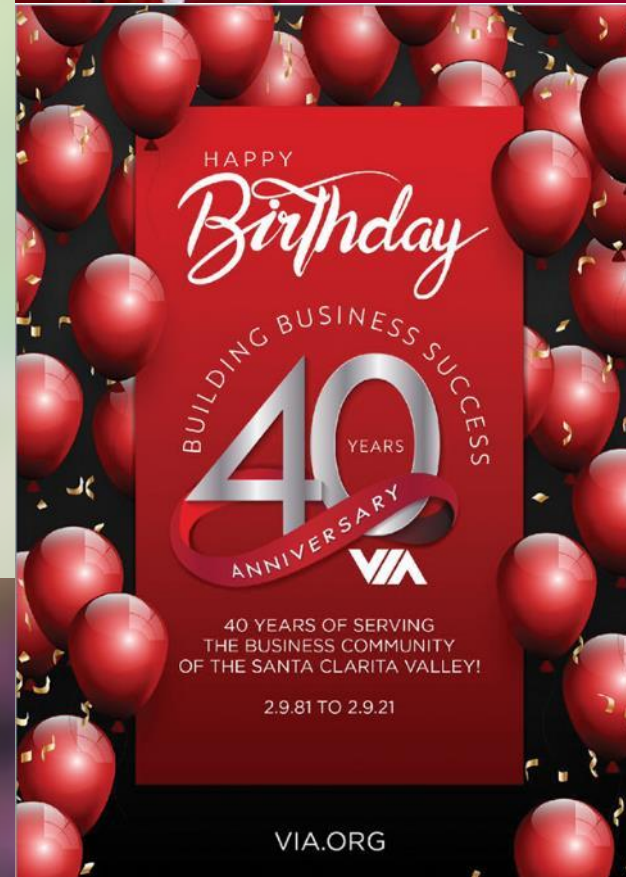
