California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office

A Call to Action for California's Community Colleges

- State Chancellor's Office outlined how the system will take action to address structural racism and ensure communities and students can access equal educational opportunity.
- Recommended follow-up activities include:
 - Systemwide review of police and first responder training and curriculum. (ASCCC, CTE Deans and Faculty)
 - Campus leaders host open dialogue and address campus climate. (CEOs, District Leaders, Campus Police, CSSOs and their Student leaders)
 - Campuses audit classroom climate and create an action plan to create inclusive classrooms and anti-racism curriculum. (Faculty, CIOs, CSSOs, ASCCC)
 - District Boards review and update Equity plans with urgency. (Chancellor's Office, All Campus Leaders, and District Trustees)
 - Shorten the time for the full implementation of the DEI Integration Plan (DEI Implementation Workgroup, Consultation Council and Chancellor's Office)
 - Engage in the Vision Resource Center "Community Colleges for Change." (Everyone)

There are initial steps that we will take to begin the important work of ensuring equity on our campuses:

- Engage student groups in online forums with college administrators, faculty, and staff so we can learn from them how the college can best support and provide a safe, inclusive and equitable experience.
- Immediately expand our equity and inclusion training opportunities to staff and faculty.
- Reevaluate our hiring practices and materials so that we are not arbitrarily and preferentially excluding people.
- Continue to support existing equity programs, and develop new resources, and services, even though we face budget challenges.
- Review our curriculum processes, delivery modes, and prerequisites to ensure they reflect the perspectives multiple races and cultures.

As we continue to engage in dialogue, listen for understanding, and hear what is being said, we will generate new ideas and action steps for moving forward.

Powerful Student Panel @ (IE)²

- The **Institutional Effectiveness and Inclusive Excellence (IE)² Committee** held its annual Summer Retreat on **Fri, June 12th** from 9 to noon.
- **The retreat centered on a student panel** as an opportunity for participants to listen, learn, and reflect on the actions we can take to bring about change and address institutional racism and student barriers.
- **110 engaged participants** joined this impactful meeting, which was facilitated by a planning group of more than 40 faculty, classified, admins, and students. The (IE)² group—in particular **Dr. Daylene Meuschke**—worked hard to organize an impactful meeting.
- **A follow-up student discussion forum is anticipated for July** as an additional opportunity to listen closely to our students and have authentic and meaningful dialogue on equity, student success, civil unrest, and systemic efforts to address racism in keeping with the CCCCO *Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Taskforce* and COC's Call to Action letter.

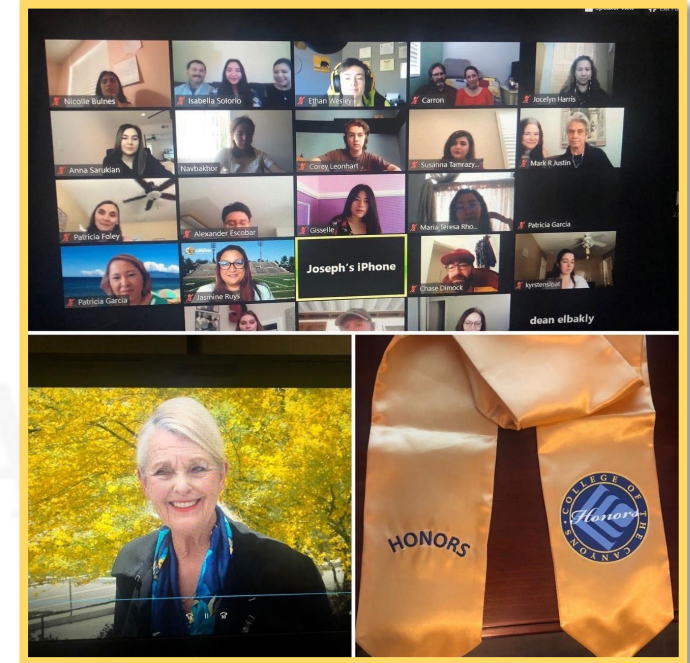
Honors / PTK Virtual Celebration

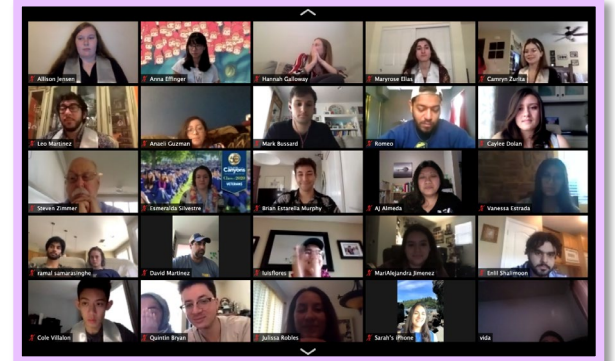

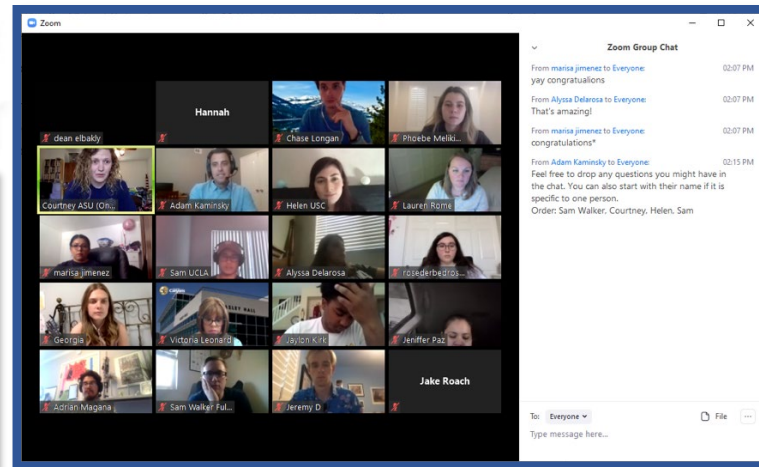


Hart District Coordination with COC

Chancellor's Updates

- College of the Canyons has been working with the William S. Hart Union High School District to help graduating seniors begin their path in higher education.
- A survey is being distributed to graduating seniors, determining their plans for the upcoming fall 2020 semester.
- The goal of the survey is to determine whether graduating seniors from the Class of 2020 will defer their acceptance into a transfer 4-year college or university, and if so, whether they plan to attend COC during the fall 2020 semester.
- The survey also asks students to identify which disciplines they may be interested in enrolling.
- Special thanks to **Dr. Ryan Theule**, **Dr. Daylene Meuschke**, and **Alicia Levalley** for their support in creating this survey so quickly to deploy to the Hart District seniors.
- In addition, quite a few sections of additional classes in History, Spanish, and Biology have been added this summer 2020 to help students continue along the path.
- Lastly, we have confirmed that our College NOW and Dual Enrollment Classes, typically taught at the Hart District high school sites, will be taught in distance education mode for the first time this fall (synchronously and asynchronously). Additional information will be specifically communicated to instructors teaching these classes prior to the start of the fall 2020 semester

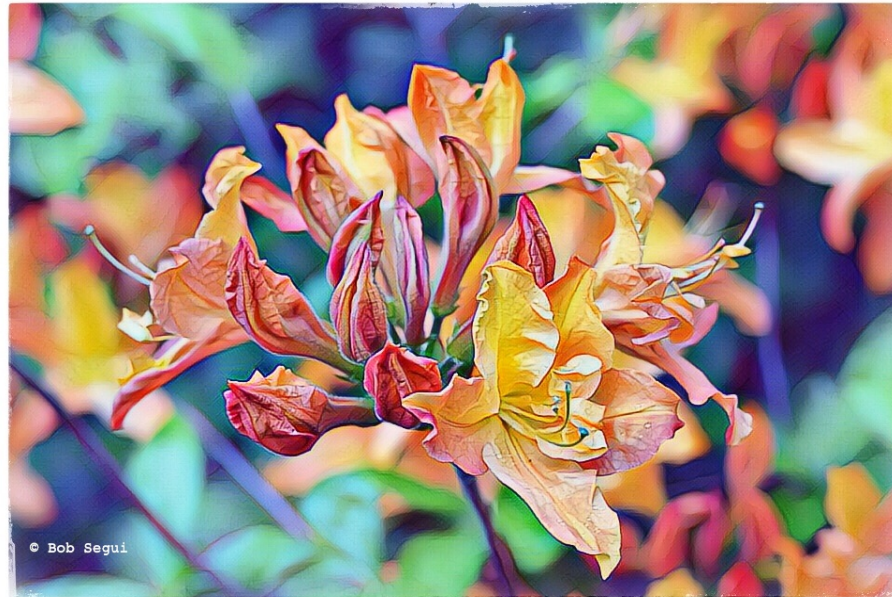


Online Teaching Conference 2020 – June 19th
