

College graduation rates by



"It took me 4 years to get up the courage to ask for help and go and find resources outside the classroom. I feel like this system was not built for me, everything is about being this independent person, but for me culturally, I was not used to that. It is hard and it feels sometimes like it is working against me but I am going to try my hardest to navigate it."—EMP participant

26% of students who are "poorest" AND have high test scores finish college compared to 70% of students who are "richest" AND have high test scores.

This speaks to other factors (e.g. lack of resources) than the aptitude of the "poorest" students.

Alliances are not Clubs

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CLUBS

- Shared interest in a topic or identity affiliation
- Outward facing, events and partnerships
- Student-lead with support from advisor
- Formal charter process to establish a club
- Eligible for ASG funds
- Require faculty advisors
- Club participation is incentivized (points))

ALLIANCES

- Focused on shared identities/ affinity in a group of people.
- ► Inward-facing, open support groups
- Organized by faculty/staff, shaped by students, no governance structure.
- No chartering process
- ► Eligible for ASG funds
- Includes other employee groups as advisors/leads
- Participation is not incentivized
- Integrated into institution-wide support programs (e.g. student success teams)

Lead Student 3, same here - glad to hear you're good. Hopefully your cousin gets better soon.


Lead 2: I'm sorry Student 3! I hope you and your family will be safe and healthy.

- 93 students participated
- ▶ 124 service counts (repeat participants)


