



PLANNING TO TRANSFER?

Many students plan to transfer to a 4 year university. Building your academic plan to meet the various prerequisite requirements can be challenging. However, there are great programs that you can follow to achieve your academic goals!

The UC TAG application is OPEN!



For UC campus admission, fill out the Transfer Admission Guarantee, or TAG. This is an application found on the UC TAP website. UC Davis, Irvine, Merced, Riverside and Santa Barbara campuses offer majors that guarantee your admission based on a contract. Applications for Fall 2022 admission opened on Sept. 1 and close on Sept. 30

Associate Degrees for Transfer

For a CSU campus, there are associate degrees called "Associates Degree for Transfer" that allow you to have priority admission to CSU campuses that have agreements from the community college. You can access this search function on calstate.edu under the transfer application page. These are the two programs that act like the backbone of the classes you should take. Under each major, you can visit the website of the university that you are researching and find a list of courses required for that major, along with the GPA you should maintain. Now, you need to take classes which fulfill these requirements. In order to find the courses at College of the Canyons that translate to the 4 year universities you are interested in, you need to search your major, community college, and the 4 year university that you wish to transfer to under Assist.org.

All of this information is hard to plan; it can be challenging for you to figure your plan out by yourself. Be sure to visit the counseling office for academic questions and planning!

What would you advise to students at COC that want to transfer to a university?

My advice for students applying to transfer is to do their research early! This includes meeting with counselors as well as reviewing articulation agreements between COC and the schools you're interested in. At the end of the day, your coursework comes first, so be sure to go to office hours to stay on top of your classes. Lastly, make sure not to procrastinate on your application, especially if it involves essay writing. When writing college essays, my advice is to ensure that your passion/ interest shines through your words. Good luck to all the COC students transferring this cycle!


