## Eligibility

Candidates are deemed scholastically eligible for admission to the DMS Program when:

1. They have completed all prerequisites with a grade of C (75% or better).
2. Their overall GPA for all courses from every college attended as it appears on college transcripts is 2.5 or better

## Selection

Candidate selection procedure:

1. Candidates who meet the minimum qualifications to be invited to sit for the ATI TEAS examination or to submit their ATI TEAS results if taken previously.
2. ATI TEAS score and scores achieved for all items per the multi-criteria screening (including Bonus Points earned) will be tallied.
3. Candidates will be ranked based on the total points achieved and invited to the program.
4. In the event multiple candidates achieve the same score for the last available seats, a random lottery process will be performed to determine those accepted for the cohort up to the approved class size. Candidates with the same score, but not selected, will be randomly placed on a waitlist/alternate list.
5. Communication regarding acceptance will begin via email by late June/early July of each year. Emails will be sent to the email address included in the online application.
6. Confirmation of Acceptance must be returned via email within 2 weeks of receipt of the dated email, or the candidate will be removed from the accepted Student list and the next alternate selected until the class is full.
7. All Accepted Students must attend a mandatory orientation session held prior to the start of the semester. Students not attending the orientation session will be removed from the accepted Student list and the next alternate selected until the class is full
8. Candidates not selected may re-apply for the subsequent starts and strengthen their portfolio by updating and resubmitting the required
