## 9/15/2025

The unit value of STAT C1000H is listed incorrectly in the MATHEMATICS section of the Catalog. The correct unit value for this course is 4 units.

The unit values of STAT C1000H and STAT C1000E are listed incorrectly when noted in the program requirements for programs that require STAT C1000 or STAT C1000E or STAT C1000H. The correct unit values for these courses are:

- STAT C1000E: 5 units
- STAT C1000H: 4 units

Page 120:

CYBR-260 Prerequisites should read **NETECH-211 and CYBR 241**

Page 146:

**Fire Technology Pre-Service A.S. Degree** should have HLHSCI-151 (5 units), HLHSCI-151L (2 units), and HLHSCI-152 (1.5 units) listed as required courses in place of HLHSCI-151 (9.5 units). Total Major units required now 32.5 units

Page 147:

**Fire Technology Pre-Service Certificate of Achievement** should have HLHSCI-151 (5 units), HLHSCI-151L (2 units), and HLHSCI-152 (1.5 units) listed as required courses in place of HLHSCI-151 (9.5 units). Total Certificate units required now 26.5 units.

Page 35:

### Pass/No Pass Regulations:

1. Students may use a "P" grade, when that grading option is available for students enrolled in the course, to satisfy major requirements for any associate degree that includes the District's local general education pattern.
2. Students may not use a "P" grade in major courses needed to earn associate degrees that do not include the District's local general education pattern, unless a student (1) submits a petition to the Counseling Department requesting an exception to the prohibition and (2) dialogues with a counselor regarding the potential impact of electing P/ NP grades for major coursework on the student's educational goals. As an exception to this limitation, students may use a "P" grade in major courses needed to earn associate degrees using any general education pattern if that "P" grade is assigned as Credit for Prior Learning ("CPL"), including Advanced Placement ("AP") credit, approved pursuant to the District's CPL and AP related policies and procedures. Students should be aware that courses graded P/NP might not be accepted in a transfer major, and are advised to consult with their intended transfer institution.
3. Students completing general education patterns other than the District's local general pattern are subject to the limitations of that pattern in the number of general education units allowed as P/NP.
4. Students who elect to take a course on a pass/no pass basis must receive approval from their counselor and file a Pass/No Pass Petition in the Admissions and Records Office before the last day of that course transpires.

5. Courses in which this option is available are indicated in the class schedule.
6. Students who elect to be evaluated on a P/NP basis do not have the option of reversing their decision at a later date.
7. Students taking courses on a P/NP basis are held responsible for all assignments and examinations.
8. Courses graded on a P/NP basis are not counted in calculating grade point average; however, they are considered in calculating progress probation/dismissal.
9. Students electing to take courses on a P/NP basis must meet any course prerequisite prior to enrolling in the course.
10. Some courses are offered on a P/NP basis only. These courses are listed in the college catalog.
