- 1. <u>Program Review Committee Annual Chair Report</u>, Erika Torgeson (pg. 14-15)
 - An overview of the committee's functions was shared. There are two program reviews, instructional and non-instructional. There are new prompt changes in data visualization and budget. There are new academic program review labs. Anyone interested can contact Erika. There is a new <u>"Planning Page"</u> and CANVAS shell.
- 2. Academic Senate Presidents Report, Lisa Hooper
 - <u>Senate Cabinet Roles</u>: President, Curriculum & Policy Committee Chair roles remain unchanged; the Vice President assumes the role of offices. Nicole is acting Policy Chair as Gary Collis is on load bank. Lisa was the previous Communications officer.
 - <u>Senate Executive Committee:</u> Garrett will chair the Senate Executive committee that manages the nominations for faculty awards.
 - <u>Communications Officer</u>: Erica Seubert has many ideas and will continue to provide a summary of action items that will be shared with Senators and Deans on Fridays or Mondays.
 - <u>Faculty in the Spotlight:</u> This will be stalled.
 - <u>BONH Renovations Update</u>: There is a new clock. The Emeriti slides will be uploaded soon. There is a new schedule tablet outside the room. Facilities is working on new signage. New American and CA flags will be ordered.
 - <u>Commencement Committee Update:</u> The next commencement will be scheduled on a Friday night with a keynote speaker at the stadium.
 - <u>Campus Safety Advisory Committee</u>: All first aid kits have been inventoried and are current. In some areas the emergency bins have been placed in cabinets. Jim Temple changed the length of the locks.
 - <u>COVID clearances:</u> If a student is out due to being positive for COVID faculty need to check the My Canyons roster to see if they are cleared. Faculty can notify the district if a student has a case of COVID to covid@canyons.edu.
 - Academic Staffing Committee (ASC): Erik Altenbernd is chairing the ASC and put out a call for

presentations on Oct. 1st, 15th & Nov. 5th. Recommendations will go to the President.

- <u>Tenure Committees:</u> New resources will be shared with Tenure Committee chairs & peers. There will be new Tenure Committee Training modules soon.
- <u>BANC</u>: Gail Freund is now at the BANC and is developing a Wellness Center space and is requesting some for donations so that students can redirect their attention.
- <u>OER Advocacy Taskforce Courses:</u> Some faculty received an email that their courses were identified to be used in data collection analysis of OER. This data is anonymous. Those who want to opt out can notify James Glapa-Grossklag.
- <u>Academic Accommodation Letters:</u> Faculty are getting letters later in the term. The recommendation is to invite the AAC director to the Senate to determine which students receive accommodations and how long the assessments take.
- <u>New Website Service</u>: There is a new website service. The district is not using a new front-end facing system. As a result, there are broken links and areas not working well. There are also new CANVAS updates.
- <u>Common Course Numbering (CCN)/AB 1111:</u> The state is slowing the process on the second round but did sunshine 10-21 courses. This is a system wide legislative mandate. The law is not just to change the number but also how the courses are being taught. There will be an upcoming presentation.
- <u>Open Seats</u>: The district may move away from add authorizations. Options will come to Senate.
- <u>CALGETS Changes</u>: There are concerns from counselors with degree audits, CCN and Datatel.
- Adjunct Scheduler: HR is being encouraged to update this list every year.
- <u>MQE committee:</u> Changes on how HR and the MQE committee will work together are being discussed.

- Master's in geology, geophysics, earth sciences, meteorology, oceanography or paleontology **OR**
- Bachelor's in geology AND Master's in geography, physics, or geochemistry OR
- Equivalency: An official transcript documenting successful completion of any Master's degree from an accredited institution of higher education AND official transcripts documenting successful completion of 24 semester units in the discipline at the upper division and graduate level, a minimum of which must be 12 graduate level semester units.

The following information is provided by Dr. Seubert to qualify for an additional discipline assignment in Earth Sciences:

- PhD in Biology from USC
- BS in Marine Science with a concentration in Biology from Long Island University
- Equivalency Worksheet documenting completion of **37** semester units in the discipline at the upper division and graduate level, with **21** graduate level semester units.

Erica Seubert meets the minimum qualifications with:

- PhD in Biology from USC
- Successful completion of 24 semester units in the discipline at the upper division and graduate level, with 12 graduate level semester units.

It would appear that Dr. Seubert meets the minimum qualifications for the disciplines of:

- D. Background and Purpose of MQ&E: After the Community College Reform Act (AB 1725) passed the legislature in 1988, California Community College Teaching Credentials were no longer issued and the hiring of faculty and administrators to teach at the California Community Colleges was based on minimum qualifications for each discipline. The law allows for local Academic Senates to establish equivalencies to the minimum qualifications listed in the Discipline List. The equivalencies must be true equivalencies that include general education knowledge as well as discipline specific knowledge. The Minimum Qualifications and Equivalencies to the minimum qualifications and committee (MQE) of the Senate developed a process for establishing equivalencies to the minimum qualifications at COC as outlined in Administrative Procedures 7121. These procedures were approved by the Academic Senate on September 26, 2013, modified after the Academic Senate voted to remove particular equivalencies on November 10, 2016, and revised in spring 2017 and approved by the Academic Senate on May 25, 2017. The MQ&E committee is currently in the process of reviewing and updating AP 7121.

- E. **Summary**: Over the last two years, the MQ&E Committee worked hard to review the "Local Use of a Functioning Equivalency Process" from a DEI focused perspective. Executive Order 20-01 charged us with the task of ensuring our equivalency process would help improve faculty diversity through increasing faculty hiring and reducing barriers to employment. We collaborated with HR to make sure AP 7120 was aligned with AP7121. This semester we are focused on adding language to AP7121 to clearly define the process of how we handle Equivalencies, how we review MQs and how we review the discipline each new/revised course is assigned to in eLumens. We look forward to working with the Policy committee and HR on this exciting task.
- F. **Goals**: Our committee's priority will continue to be reviewing all course discipline assignments and faculty discipline assignments. As stated earlier, we are also heavily focused on editing AP7121 to make sure the work of our committee is accurately reflected in the Administrative Procedure.
- G. **Challenges**: Keeping all faculty informed with how Minimum Qualifications works has always been a challenge for our committee. The process can be confusing and causes many employees, especially Department Chairs and Hiring Committee leads, a lot of frustration. We have been working to connect with more faculty and we offered an open FLEX Training this past Monday, September 16, 2024. We will continue to educate the campus and help answer any inquires or questions throughout the year. We are also working on the current Equivalencies process and hope to strengthen our relationship with HR and bring more transparency to the current process.

AP 5031 Instructional Materials

Education Code Sections 76365; Title 5 Sections 59400 et seq.; California Community College Chancellor's Office Student Fee Handbook

I. Definitions

- a. "Required instructional materials" means any materials which a student must procure or possess as a condition of registration, enrollment or entry into a class; or any such material which the instructor determines is necessary to achieve the required objectives of a course.
- b. "Solely or exclusively available from the District" means that the instructional material is not available except through the District, or that the District requires that the instructional material be purchased or procured from it. A material shall not be considered to be solely or exclusively available from the District if it is provided to the student at the District's actual cost; and 1) the instructional material is otherwise generally available, but is provided solely or exclusively by the District for health and safety reasons; or 2) the instructional material is provided in lieu of other generally available but more expensive material which would otherwise be required.
- c. "Required instructional materials which are of continuing value outside of the classroom setting" are materials which can be taken from the classroom setting and which are not wholly consumed, used up, or rendered valueless as they are applied in achieving the required objectives of a course to be accomplished under the supervision of an instructor during the class.
- d. "Instructional Materials Fees" shall refer to fees for required instructional materials that the District charges and collects from a student along with course enrollment fees. The phrase does not apply to costs of required instructional materials, such as required textbooks, that a student incurs from a third-party seller.

II. Guidelines for Required Instructional Materials

a. Students may be required to provide instructional materials required for a credit or non-credit course. Such materials shall be of continuing value to a student outside of the classroom setting and shall not be solely or exclusively available from the District.

- b. Required instructional materials shall not include materials used or designed primarily for administrative purposes, class management, course management, or supervision.
- c. Where required instructional materials are available to a student temporarily through a license or access fee, the student shall be provided options at the time of purchase to maintain full access to the instructional materials for varying periods of time ranging from the length of the class up to at least two years. The terms of the license or access fee shall be provided to the student in a clear and understandable manner prior to purchase.
- d. Instructors shall take reasonable steps to minimize the cost and ensure the necessity of required instructional materials.
- e. The District shall publish these procedures in the college catalog.

III. Guidelines for Required Instructional Materials Fees

- a. In establishing any instructional materials fees, the District shall adhere to the guidelines published in the Student Fee Handbook by the California Community College Chancellor's Office (CCCCO).
- b. All approved instructional materials fees associated with the specific courses shall be included as part of the course description in the class schedule.
- c. All instructional materials fees shall be charged and collected with the enrollment fees for the course.
- d. The District shall regularly review all instructional materials fees to determine that the fee is appropriate and reasonable.
- e. The Offices of Instruction and Student Services shall coordinate the gathering of any data necessary to respond to inquiries regarding fees by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office.
