It is also closely linked to the Chancellor's Vision for Success, which consists of seven goals for community colleges to achieve that will provide students with the support and resources they need to get on and stay on the path until they complete their educational goal.

- See our students succeed and complete their educational pathway.

WHAT ARE THE GOALS OF THE LEAP GUIDED PATHWAYS PROGRAM?

Throughout the LEAP Guided Pathways program, sessions will focus on the following goals:

- Explain the Guided Pathways framework and define the role every employee plays in its implementation;
- Enhance employee engagement and ownership of Guided Pathways;
- Advance the efforts of the Canyons Completes work groups;
- Intersect and weave together the efforts of departments already working on Guided Pathways and Canyons Completes;
- Focus on the accountability standards of Guided Pathways and work to remove distractions to allow us to focus on the daily efforts that support Guided Pathways;
- Infuse equity into all content;
- Use data to guide the work of the Solution Teams;
- Conduct an environmental scan and gap analysis of current work being done on Guided Pathways to identify areas to improve and build momentum for its implementation;
- Manage transitional change effectively;
- Participate in a Solution Team Project in collaboration with the Canyons Completes work groups.

WHAT WILL MY INVESTMENT IN LEAP GUIDED PATHWAYS LOOK LIKE?

There are three components to LEAP Guided Pathways:

- **Six in-class sessions** that will be held on Fridays during the fall and spring semesters:
 - Overview of Guided Pathways framework, Canyons Completes, student equity, use of data, and identification of best practices.
 - Pillar One: Clarify the Path
 - Pillar Two: Enter the Path
 - Pillar Three: Stay on the Path
 - Pillar Four: Ensure Learning
 - Presentation of Solution Team Projects
- Interactive Work on a Solution Team Project in collaboration with the Canyons Completes work groups. LEAP participants will be placed into Solution Teams who will work collaboratively on realworld projects that will advance the efforts of the Guided Pathways work groups. A mentor will be provided for each Solution Team to assist in the development of the project and in preparation of the final presentation.

• Shadowing a Canyons Completes Work Group.

All sessions will be highly interactive and include applied use of the concepts. Leadership skills development on managing transition and approaching change will be offered. Participants will do an environmental scan and gap analysis of what we are already doing well and then identify what needs to be improved. In addition, training on advocacy and case building will be infused into the curriculum.

- **Introduce** strategies to put Guided Pathways/Canyons Completes on everyone's desk!

Time to work on Solution Teams will be scheduled on the afternoons of the in-class sessions and may also take place on other days outside of the scheduled sessions.




WHAT IS GUIDED PATHWAYS AND CANYONS COMPLETES?
