Recognized for its commitment to innovation and partnerships, College of the Canyons consistently creates new opportunities for student access, engagement, and success.

First Bachelor's Program Launches

COC's first-ever bachelor of science in building performance is the only one of its kind in California. The new degree launched in January 2025, providing students with a cost-effective pathway to careers involved with creating high-performance buildings by preparing them for the state-recognized Certified Energy Analyst exam, and in the expanding architecture, engineering, and construction industries. www.canyons.edu/bsbp

New Healthcare Programs Coming Soon

Four new programs planned for 2025 will prepare students for careers in fast-growing healthcare fields.



Physical Therapist Assistant – PTAs work in hospitals, private practices, outpatient, sports facilities, and more. The program can be completed in four semesters, with graduates eligible to take the national exam. www.canyons.edu/pta



Occupational Therapy Assistant – Occupational Therapy helps patients of all ages in the development, rehabilitation, enhancement, and preservation of essential life and work skills. The 16-month program includes fieldwork that prepares students for the national exam and to successfully work in the field. www.canyons.edu/ota



Pharmacy Technology – Pharmacy technicians assist licensed pharmacists with preparing medications in pharmacies, hospitals, and long-term care facilities. This program can be completed in just two semesters, helping students to start work quickly. www.canyons.edu/pharmacy



Diagnostic Medical Sonography – The two-year program will see students earn an associate degree, plus 1,100 hours of hands-on clinical experience that will prepare them for licensing exams and careers as ultrasound technicians. **www.canyons.edu/dms**

Advanced Technology Center Takes Shape

New equipment and training options continue to expand the capabilities of the interim Advanced Technology Center. The eight-course Milling and Tooling Pathway certificate program will qualify students for apprenticeships with local companies. The need for a larger, permanent ATC is clear, and we are moving forward with plans to build it on the Valencia Campus. When completed, it will provide advanced training that equips students for careers in high-tech fields, keeps local companies at the forefront of their industries, and enhances the economic development of our community. atc.canyons.edu

Golf Teams Claim Dual Championships

The 2023-24 academic year was the fourth time Coach Gary Peterson led both women's and men's golf teams to state titles in the same year. The women claimed the program's fifth California Community College Athletic Association State Championship in fall 2023. The men's team brought home the program's 11th state championship, and third in the last four seasons, in spring 2024.
