NURSING PROGRAM PREREQUISITE COURSES (Effective with Aug 2026 application cycle & beyond) Courses must be completed with a grade of C or better <i>before</i> applying to the Nursing Program, and when averaged together, English, Anatomy, Physiology, Microbiology, Communication and Psychology prerequisites must meet a minimum 2.5 GPA* to be eligible to apply to the program. NOTE: There is no recency policy for prerequisites. Completing the prerequisites does not ensure admission into the program.

COC has many RN-BSN Concurrent Enrollment Options occurring with various Universities (CSUN, CSUDH, CSUCI, National University, Ohio University, & Grand Canyon Univ)-- see COC Nursing website for details. Students interested in these programs should consider completing a Critical Thinking course, Statistics, and Chemistry 151 prior to beginning the first semester of the COC nursing program, ideally. It is also in the best interest of the student to have the Cal-GETC (or relevant) transfer general education requirements complete or near completion. **Additional major prerequisites vary per university & application details vary, it's advised that you make a COC Counseling appointment for additional guidance** (<https://www.canyons.edu/student-services/counseling/connect/appointments.php>).

THE APPLICATION AND SELECTION PROCESS

It is important to refer to the nursing website for all deadlines and application instructions! **A background check will be completed after an invitation for admission into the nursing program is received.**

1. SUBMIT DOCUMENTS TO ADMISSIONS	If <u>any or all</u> of the following apply, please submit documents to Admissions and Records: 1) Current official transcripts from <u>all</u> colleges attended, except COC (must include <u>ALL</u> coursework regardless if courses are nursing prerequisites or not. <i>If coursework is from the LACCD, please make sure your official transcripts are not electronic copies, but are printed official transcripts from LACCD –must have overall GPA on transcripts submitted.</i>) 2) For transcripts from other countries, an official sealed foreign transcript evaluation from a NACES approved agency 3) Official LVN Program transcripts 4) Official military transcripts 5) Math placement test results (if needed for documentation of eligibility for Intermediate Algebra or higher) 6) Official College Board report of <u>ALL</u> AP scores (passed with scores of 3 or above) –not accepted from High School transcript 7) Official College Board CLEP Math score (if applicable and counting for Math credit) 8) Make sure all submitted transcripts are current, have all grades posted with nothing “IN PROGRESS”, and include overall college GPA. Please note this may require ordering an updated copy of official transcripts to be submitted prior to the deadline.
2. APPLICATION SUBMISSION	Once all the above has been completed, submit the online Nursing Program Application available on the nursing website and all required supporting documents during the application period. Applicants who submit incomplete applications or who are missing any required documents will automatically be ineligible.
3. SCHOLASTIC ELIGIBILITY (*Students not meeting eligibility criteria are offered a remediation plan.)	Upon receipt of application, a scholastic eligibility will be determined through the California Community College Chancellor's Office approved formula which calculates the student's probability of successfully completing the ADN program. The formula uses the following criteria: 1) Core Biology GPA – all Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology courses taken at the college level. 2) Core Biology Repetitions – the number of times a student has repeated a Core Biology course (for previous grades of D, F, FW, or W). 3) English GPA – all transferrable English course grades 4) Overall GPA – For all courses from <u>every</u> college attended as it appears on college transcripts (includes non-degree applicable courses)
4. ASSESSMENT ATI TEAS (7) TEST (1 st score only)	If notified of eligibility, qualified applicants will be required to take a state approved nursing assessment test. Students must rank at the required level to be eligible for admission into the program. Visit www.atitesting.com for practice tests and materials. If already taken, the 1 st score of this exam will be required and used in the selection process.
5. SELECTION & ADMISSION	Final selections are made using both multi-criteria screening for ranking (that includes GPA and 1 st score on TEAS) and random selection. Students will be notified for admission to the Nursing Program.

NURSING COURSES

Once accepted into the Nursing Program, all courses for the major must be completed with a grade of “C” or better for a **minimum 2.0 GPA**. Please refer to the grading policy in the Nursing Student Handbook (available online).
