

Certificate of Specialization: Women and Gender Studies

This certificate will offer students the opportunity to critically explore how gender shapes and is shaped by social, political, historical, and cultural forces. Grounded in inclusive frameworks, this certificate will prepare students to navigate and lead in an increasingly complex and interconnected world. Through an interdisciplinary lens, students will examine how gender intersects with race, class, sexuality, ability, and other axes of identity and power.

Students will be able to analyze global gendered experiences across history and culture, including the intersections of sexism with other systems of oppression, including racism, classism, heterosexism, ageism, and transphobia.
