Background: AB 705 is an assembly bill that requires community colleges to place students into transfer-level English and Mathematics courses based on high school performance (ex. standardized test scores) with the goal of reducing remedial courses. AB 1705 strengthens AB 705 by decreasing remedial course placement and increasing transfer-level courses in all community courses. Mathematics Professor and Math Club Advisor, Violeta Kovacev-Nikolic, reached out to ASG in regard to hosting a preliminary meeting to discuss the negative impact of AB 705 & 1705 assembly bills on our STEM students' preparedness and how ASG may make a difference. Amna Fadel, Vice President of Advocacy, met with Professor Violeta on November 6th. Now, Professor Violeta would like to present to ASG.

Math Professor Violeta shares a PowerPoint for AB705/1705.

STEM students will be placed in Calculus starting in the Fall 2025.

Remedial courses in math will no longer be offered.

Geometry has also been removed as a credit course.

May not place students in different levels of math as of the fall semester.

Some students that may not be ready for a level course may impede the class time of other students with questions that should be known.

A Prerequisite discussion takes place on the importance of taking these courses.

The different areas that involve math are also discussed.

A video of reclaiming student success is discussed.

Those who benefit from not offering these courses are student loan companies.

The funding source is also discussed.

Limits access with removing remedial courses.

English and Math are not the only classes that will be impacted.

Giving access and removing barriers is the foundation for success.

California Acceleration Project (CAP) is discussed.

MESA holds workshops and GLA's.

Another option is noncredit courses for some math classes.

Calculus with support will also be introduced next semester.

Noncredit classes include up to Algebra to equal 19 courses.

This semester, the instructor's class was not filled, which is not common, and the success rate is lower.

Many unprepared students will be one of the outcomes from this taking effect in fall 2025.

How ASG may support is to raise awareness.

The placement test is discussed as something that is beneficial to incoming students as it gives more options.
