Shifting printing stations to the Library and Alumni Day and Multicultural Day are ideas for this year.

Awards or banquet at the end is another idea for ASG members but may not be an allowable expense.

Could still hold this event but not as Legacy Project.

Town hall as well as the printing stations are the two ideas for a Legacy Project.

At any point during the year, ideas are welcomed for Legacy Project.
