- Club funds are frozen except for payment of outstanding debts.

- A club on probation is ineligible for A.S.G. Matching Funds and is ineligible to submit a budget request for the A.S.G. annual grants process.
- A club on probation may not vote on Inter Club Council matters.
- A club on probation is ineligible to earn Inter Club Council incentive points.
