Background: This year COC is hosting the 1st Annual College of the Canyons Empowerment Conference on April 25th, 2025. They will also be a Small Business Vendor Fair there, that opportunity for current and past students to sell their products at the COC Campus to support.

Flyers are passed out and the website is pulled up on the Empowerment conference.

Samir from Counseling in EOPS and Care is here to talk about an event proposed by the LEAP program.

Academic, career, personal, and financial are the four different categories.

A collaboration of campus talent will be at the event along with free lunch.

Yes, one club for example has three cultures to select from a hat.

Information was added on creating an email specific to the school for chartered clubs at the college.

Must be a COC email.

Also, information was added to include a new type of club called a Bite club.

Clubs would be limited to no funding but may still meet as a Bite Club.

An example of why a club would choose to be a Bite Club is given.

Bite Clubs would not have to adhere to the same rules as chartered clubs.

May still hold an event but could not get funding or go off campus.

The other change is adding a clause that non-credit students may be members as well as holding a club officer position.

The portion added is highlighted in yellow and the language was taken from the employment section for the college.

Background: The form to apply for ASG Grants has opened. We have a presentation for more information

The presentation is pulled up and the requirements are reviewed.

The deadline is April 2nd and clubs must have earned at least 400 ICC points.

One submission per club is allowed.

Things that ASG will not fund are reviewed.

The grant categories are also reviewed: student welfare, student equity, civic engagement, student enrichment, campus culture, sustainability.

Some important questions to anticipate would be to explain why you chose the selected category.

Also, other ways that your club has raised funds should be explained is.

Some tips from ASG are to have enough ICC points by 5-15.

If you do not get the grant, the 400 ICC points will then be returned to the club.

Complete the form with your advisor.

The funds will be used during the 2025-2026 school year.

Questions may be directed to the ASG Executive Vice President.

If a club is interested in obtaining access to a specific program to work on graphic art, would this be an acceptable request?

That is acceptable request for a grant.

Limited number of \$500 grants will be available, and you are not guaranteed to get a grant if you apply.

An example is given on the types of groups that apply and what they apply for.

Can the other club members speak on behalf of the club in the video?

Other clubs in the past showed how the money was used or what the money will be used for.
