



Courses completed by students were tracked from their first course in 2010/11 to Winter 2014. There are two important notes. The analyses included all new students and new transfer students in 2010/11, and did not exclude any students based on stated educational goal. This was done to allow the actual course taking behavior to be analyzed independent of the stated educational goal. The second note is that only local courses successfully completed were included. Courses completed at other colleges and Advanced Placement courses were not available to be included in these analyses.

### **Degree Completion**

As indicated in Tables 2 through 5, more than 2,000 new students or new transfer students completed one or more Sociology courses. With regard to the AA-Sociology, 26 of the 33 students who completed seven or eight of the requirements earned an associate degree. All but one of the degrees was in Sociology. Of the 125 students who completed four to six requirements, 34 earned an associate degree and 12 of the 34 associate degrees were in Sociology.

With regard to the AAT-Sociology Degree requirements, 36 of the 75 students who completed five or six of the degree requirements earned an associate degree related to Sociology. Ten of the 75 students earned degrees other than Sociology. There were 288 students who completed three or four requirements, with 89 completing an associate degree, only one of which was a Sociology degree.

With regard to the AA-Social Science degree program, 899 students completed three or more requirements. Of the 899 students, 268 completed Associate degrees and only 84 were Social Science degrees.

A total of 26 students in the 2010/11 new student and new transfer student cohort completed one or more SHARP courses. Of the 26 students, four completed all four requirements.

### Completion of Degree Requirements

Tables 6 through 9 indicates the number of students who have completed each of the requirements for the degrees listed. For the AA-Sociology degree, the greatest number of students completed the first (SOC1-101 or 101H) and fifth (SOC1-135, MATH-140, or MATH-140H) requirements. Relatively few students completed the second requirement (SOC1-102) and third requirement (SOC1-108). While 721 students completed one of the courses for the fourth requirement (SOC1-103, SOC1-103H, SOC1-105, SOC1-110, SOC1-150, SOC1-200, SOC1-200H, SOC1-205, SOC1-207, SOC1-208, SOC1-210, SOC1-230, or SOC1-233), 59 students completed all four required courses. Only 3 students completed the elective (SOC1-136).

With regard to the AAT-Sociology Degree program, the most frequent requirements met was requirement #1 (SOCI-101 or 101H). At least 400 students completed at least one course for each of the requirements. Only 58 students completed both required courses for Requirement #2 (SOCI-102, MATH-140, MATH-140H, PSYCH-104, or SOCI-135).

For the AA-Social Science Degree program, the most frequent requirements completed were the first (PSYCH-101, PSYCH-101H, PSYCH-172, OR PSYCH-172H) and third requirement (SOCI-101, SOCI-101H, or SOCI-207). Relatively few students completed the fifth (POLISC-230, POLISC-250, or POLISC-270) or all three courses for Requirement #6 (BUS-126, COMS-260, ECON-201, ECON-201H, GEOG-102, HIST-120, HIST-120H, HIST-240, PSYCH-235, PSYCH-240, PSYCH-272, SOCI-103, SOCI-103H, SOCI-105, SOCI-150, SOCI-200, SOCI-200H, or SOCI-233).

As indicated in Table 9, a very similar number of students completed each of the SHARP requirements, ranging from 12 to 25 students. The four requirements were SHARP 101, SHARP 102, SHARP 103, and SHARP 104, respectively.
