Report for The CLSA Board Meeting in Oakland on February 6, 2016

The Surveying Merit Badge event held at College of the Canyons on Saturday, December 5, 2015 was a success by any measure, even if space here limits me to only three of the four I would like to offer.

I offer my "expert opinion" as the first measure, since I want to save the best of three for last. The event could not have been better organized, thanks to Regina Blasberg, the Chair of the Engineering Technologies Department and Land Surveying Program at College of the Canyons. She not only volunteered her time and skills, she also arranged the perfect place with the perfect equipment. Of greatest importance was the appeal she made months in advance that brought about what I thought was an ideal mix of skilled volunteers with both teaching experience and Scouting backgrounds: Tony Pratt and Resur Bongolan among others, including myself.

Surveying for (Scout's name) is the 92nd merit badge earned (out of 137) and he really enjoyed it especially the hands-on and FIELD experience you were able to showcase is not too common. To be right next to college students during the session who were equally training and learning the same discipline was remarkable....

More importantly, I want to thank you for dedicating a full Saturday for teaching my son a great new skill and opening our eyes to what we see often around our city and don't take the time to fully appreciate what you all do to make our streets and dwellings safe. I know there was much planning involved having taught several merit badges myself to large groups of scouts.
