- The summary for the Academic Senate meeting for April 14, 2005 was approved. (Typographical changes are included on a meeting summary addendum.)
- The Senate and Curriculum calendars for 2005-06 were tabled. We will see if we can adjust the calendars to allow for some additional curriculum committee meetings.
- For information on the Statewide Senate's resolutions, please contact Michael Dermody.
- **The Discipline Assignment Committee** recommended, and the Senate ratified, the establishment of the "Health and Safety" discipline for non-credit courses at COC. In a related note, due to some changes from the Chancellor's Office, some of our recently approved non-credit courses are being revised by Karen Myers so that they can be resubmitted.
- The revisions to the Adjunct Hiring Procedures were confirmed, with minor technical changes. (Please see addendum)
- The establishment of an interim non-credit hiring procedure was not approved. In the Fall, the Senate will be reviewing and developing curriculum and related procedures for the non-credit courses. Until that time, the adjunct hiring process will be used for non-credit. It was also noted that the current adjunct hiring process has a clause for emergency hires.
- A discussion on on-line/hybrid courses was tabled until a further meeting. Lea Templer urged that we review some of the basic curricular and pedagogical philosophies that the campus has traditionally held regarding on-line/hybrid courses. There was also a desire to discuss proctoring methods for on-line/hybrid courses. This discussion will take place at a later meeting.
- **Soup and Surprise was reviewed**. There was a discussion on the continued viability of the program. The participation level seems to have declined this semester is this just a temporary trend? Ideas for improving attendance included additional advertising, better explanation of the program, and reviewing the days for the events. More discussion will follow.

RE: Equivalencies for Non-Credit courses/Older Adults

Instructors of non-credit courses, like instructors of credit courses, must meet certain minimum qualifications to be able to teach at the college. The Board of Governors, upon the advice of the statewide Academic Senate, establishes these minimum qualifications on a statewide level.

Most "MQ"s allow for equivalencies, which are determined by the local Senate. Pending the establishment of a comprehensive set of policies and procedures for non-credit courses, the Disciplines Committee recommends that the Senate approve the following equivalencies so that we can continue to move forward with non-credit courses for the summer.

The Disciplines committee would also like to remind the Senate that "equivalencies" should not be read as "lesser" or "substitute" qualifications. All equivalencies must, by definition, be equal to the stated minimum qualifications.

The Chancellor's office recently reminded Academic Senates that the establishment of single-course equivalencies is prohibited. Individuals are certified as being equivalent in a discipline, not in a course. An individual that meets the equivalency for a specific discipline is considered to have the MQ for any and all courses in that discipline.

ESTABLISHED MQ FOR NON-CREDIT/HEALTH AND FITNESS

First option	a bachelor's degree in health science, health education, biology, nursing, dietetics, or nutrition
Second	an associate degree in any of those subjects, and
Option	four years of professional experience related to the subject of the course taught

PROPOSAL 1

Licensure or certificate issued by the State of California, accrediting agency or national organization to perform work related to area of assignment **AND** six(6) years of professional.

RE: Proposed revisions to the Curriculum Committee Process

The curriculum committee is an established sub-committee of the Senate; under the Senate constitution it is recognized as the primary subcommittee of the Senate. Although the curriculum committee is charged with reviewing curricula revisions, deletions, and introductions, the establishment of process and procedure remains with the Senate at large.

In the past semester, there have been requests for procedural modifications in three areas. At this time the Senate is presented with an update on these proposed revisions.

EFFECTIVE DATE OF COURSES:

Currently, courses are approved with a "Semester of First Offering". This can cause a problem if a curricula issue for a particular course or department emerges in the middle of a semester. As such, it is recommended approval be made effective with a specific date, rather than a semester.

Under this proposal, if a department brought forward a course to the curriculum approval in the middle of the semester, that course could be offered as of the effective approval date.

For example: A typical fall semester begins in August. A vital course revision is presented and approved on October 15. That course could then be offered anytime **after** October 16 (the course could be offered as an 8-week mid semester offering).

A question arises to the actual dater of approval. Under the college's current process, the curriculum committee's report is not forwarded to the Board for final approval until the Senate ratifies that the committee followed all appropriate processes and procedures.

It is proposed that the date of the Senate ratification be established as the date of approval. The course will be considered "approved" after the date when the Senate ratified the curriculum committee's process. The course can then be offered after that date.

E-MAIL MEETINGS

Recently, there was a meeting conducted by e-mail for the approval of a specific course. If there are no controversies, and if the approval is failry pro-forma, e-mail meetings can be very efficient. However, for cases where there may be controversy and/or substantive issues for discussion, e-mail meetings are may not be conducive to proper discussion and review.

Until specific procedures have been developed for e-mail meetings, it is recommended that the curriculum committee refrain from e-mail meetings except for the most urgent issues.

It is also proposed that, pending development of such procedures, any committee member can request that an item in an "e-mail meeting" be tabled until the next regular meeting of the committee.

SUMMER MEETINGS

Although it would be helpful at times to have summer meetings of the curriculum committee, currently there are no established procedures that would allow for such meetings. It is recommended that the curriculum committee develop procedures to address the question of the curriculum committee meeting outside of the Fall and Spring semesters.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

FIRE, ADMJUS and LAPD Programs - Off Site service agreement courses: Barry Gribbons would like the Curriculum Committee to recommend a standard for dealing with curriculum for outside agencies such as the fire department and the sheriffs academy for courses that have already been taken or for courses that are in progress this semester.: Dr. Gribbons' gave a brief history of the outside agency program. Deanna Davis thanked Dr. Gribbons for the history of the program but wanted to address specifically the idea of back dating effective dates of new special topics courses and modification to existing courses. B. Gribbons clarified that "agencies do not have a guarantee or expectation of receiving college credit." In addition, B. Gribbons noted that he consulted with the district's legal counsel stating the Curriculum Committee has the authority to attach any date agreed upon.

Michael Dermody discussed documentation from Title V and the Chancellor's web site that related to the issue of whether it was good practice for a curriculum committee to backdate course approvals. D. Davis quoted from an Admissions and Records document entitled "Public Services Procedure" (dated 4/20/05) that stated that "new courses must go through our curriculum process before being offered." B. Gribbons felt the A&R procedures document was not a 'quiding document contractually bound." At this time the Curriculum Committee decided to approve the Firetc 198FF special topic on this agenda for Summer 2005, not Spring 2005, because of uncertainty over the legality and appropriateness of backdating course approvals.. At the May 5th C.C. meeting, the Committee will discuss further the District's need for other service agreement courses to be backdated. It was also agreed that the Academic Senate would revisit their policy on effective dates to consider moving from 'term' driven to 'date' driven, allowing future proposals to be approved in the same term but still with a future date.

WebCMS proposal over 6 months old: currently WebCMS has several proposals in the queue over 6 months old - some initiated as far back as 2002: 27 in Stage 1, 3 in Stage 2, and 3 in Stage 3. The curriculum coordinator desires the WebCMS queue to accurately reflect proposed curriculum. Frequently The presidents office will ask for numbers regarding curriculum; hence it is important to have a real picture of activity. Gina would like to add language to the Curriculum Handbook stating proposals will be purged after a certain period of time. **DID NOT HAVE TIME TO DISCUSS - TABLE FOR NEXT C.C. MEETING**

MAY 5 Curriculum Committee Meeting

Committee Chair opened the meeting addressing policies and procedures. Deanna provided a hand out titled "Overview of Policy and Procedural Questions Before the Curriculum Committee", a comprehensive outline reviewing recent policy issues faced by the Curriculum Committee; such as Non Credit Courses and approving curriculum for courses offered in an existing term, prior term and deadline dates. Deanna reported the Chancellor's Office does not currently have a policy on approval dates for curriculum and asked the Curriculum Committee to make a policy locally until such a policy is established at the state level. Nancy Smith included that the Curriculum Committees responsibility is to approve curriculum and not factor in eligibility to collect apportionment. As a result, the committee agreed to approve proposals effective the meeting date and move away from "term" driven effective dates. In addition, the committee will establish an approval date policy at a retreat to be scheduled early Fall 2005.
