

# Psychology AA (Associate GE Track)

## Canyon Country Campus Pathway

**Program Description:** The Associate in Arts degree in Psychology will provide students with an introduction to the field of behavior including the major perspectives, scientific foundations, and applied areas. The intent is to prepare students for future academic study in the field. The degree includes curriculum that can lead to a baccalaureate degree in psychology at a four-year college or university. The degree can also be a terminal, two-year option of study for students interested in psychology who do not wish to pursue a baccalaureate degree in the field.

**Program SLO:** Assess the influence of a variety of factors that contribute to behavior and mental processes, evaluate psychological concepts, and compare and contrast theoretical perspectives, empirical findings, and historical trends in the field of Psychology.

**Canyon Country Campus Pathway:** This pathway allows students to start and finish their program at the Canyon Country Campus (CCC) and in conjunction with Online and/or OnlineLIVE formatted courses.
