Program Description: The Art Department at College of The Canyons provides students with introductory classes in the history of art. The current program offers lecture courses that are transferable to University of California, California State University and many private art colleges in the nation. The Art History AA-T Degree mirrors the CSU and UC lower division requirements for a BA in art history. The Art History Program provides a wide range of exposure to the development of western and non-western traditions in art, demonstrating the importance of art to the development of humanity through the artistic contributions of diverse world cultures. The Art History Program also encourages critical thinking through an understanding of art in an historical context. Supporting these goals, the art gallery at College of the Canyons provides a wide-ranging program that represents diversity in culture and style. The gallery serves as an instructional tool for the study of art history.
