- Although LCO is in Santa Barbara, they are initiating a community college internship program with College of the Canyons as the primary focus for the student pool.
- This is the first internship at LCO that will target community college students.
- We continue to become more visible each year as the only community college team repeatedly being selected for NASA HASP and NASA's RockSatX programs!

COC Students Receive Edison Fire Tech Scholarships

Ten COC Fire Technology students received \$1,000 scholarships from Edison International to cover *tuition*, *books* and *school-related fees*.

- The scholarships were awarded through a \$25,000 grant from Edison International in support of the college's development of *present* and *future* fire personnel.
- In addition to the scholarship awards, this grant allows us to purchase **uniforms** for our students, and **storage** for our firefighting gear and equipment.
- This is COC's **third year** receiving Edison's Fire Technology Grant.


2021-22 January Governor's Budget Workshop





Sharlene Coleal and Jason Hinkle attended the Governor's Budget Workshop via Zoom.

- A Budget discussion was held with a panel of representatives from ACBO, DOF, LAO and Assembly Budget Committee.
- ➤ The Economic Forecast was presented by Robert McEntire, Ed.D Director, Management Consulting Services, School Services of California.
 - He attended College of the Canyons and was very complimentary of his experience and credited COC for his subsequent success.
- The BOG Vision was shared in a conversation with Pamela Haynes, President, Board of Governors.



COC Recognized in NCATC Newsletter



College of the Canyons was featured in the most recent publication of the *Network of Advanced Technology Expertise* (**NCATC**) newsletter.

- The featured article, *College of the Canyons Community College: Helping to Create an Industry 4.0 Ready Workforce*, was written by Tim Baber, Professor of Welding Technology.
- Highlighted in the article was our partnerships with the William S. Hart High School District to create career technical education dual-enrollment opportunities at the community's newest high school.
 - A 10,000-square-foot building at Castaic High School will house advanced manufacturing and welding labs.
 - Students will earn industry certifications such as NC3, AWS, and NIMS, which will ultimately position them for employment upon graduation.
 - All dual-enrollment courses offered will articulate with current certificate and degree programs offered by the college, allowing students to pursue certificates and degrees offered by the college.

Enrollment Update

Fall 2020 enrollments have now been reconciled, where the College was able to accomplish **98%** of its Adopted Budget FTES target (**5,460 FTES** compared to 5,558 FTES).

- We are offering 384 sections during Winter 2021.
- Winter 2021enrollments surpassed the Adopted Budget FTES target of 855 FTES by 21 FTES.
- > 5 sections in two of our Essential Infrastructure programs (Nursing and EMT) are being offered in-person on the Valencia campus.
- Remainder of classes are offered online or clinical offsite.
- ➤ After two weeks of registration, **Spring 2021** is currently at **2,881** credit FTES, which represents **56%** of the Adopted Budget FTES target of 5,153. Compared to Spring 2020 registration at the same point in time, we are roughly **6** FTES higher



Noncredit Receives Honorable Mention Award



The College of the Canyons noncredit program was presented an Honorable Mention award by the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges' **2021 Exemplary Program Award**.

- The award was presented virtually on **Jan. 19, 2021** at the *Board of Governors for California Community Colleges* meeting.
- Sponsored by the Foundation for California Community Colleges, the Board of Governors created the Exemplary Program Award in 1991 to recognize outstanding community college programs.
- In light of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Academic Senate chose "Equitable Practices in a Virtual Educational Environment" as the theme for this year's 2020-21 Exemplary Program award.

Drive Thru Flu Shot Events

The Student Health & Wellness Center has facilitated **3 Drive-Thru Flu Vaccination events**. Lots 15 and 2 were converted to vaccine sites on **November 06**, **December 11**, and **December 14**th.

- ➤ Incident Command assisted the health center staff with directing traffic, confirming student eligibility, providing the vaccine information sheet and consent forms.
- > Students/staff then parked in designated areas and were given the vaccine in their arm through the car window and as they exited the vaccine area information about mental health support services were provided.
- ➤ Other than fighting the wind, the events went smoothly and were successful in providing over **300 flu vaccinations** to our campus community.



Grants Development Department Update

Following the retirement of Theresa Zuzevich, the new **Director of Grants Development, Amber Cole**, joins the College this January.

Amber brings more than **15 years** of full-time grants experience, has a master's degree in *Administrative Leadership*, and brings extensive capability in the development and writing of *grant proposals*, *budgets*, and *application process*. It's a pleasure to welcome her!

Notable recent COC grant awards include:

- ➤ **Dept. of Education Open Textbook Pilot Grant**: \$370K award with COC participating as part of a 5-college consortium for online training and an OER community of practice (James Glapa-Grossklag and Joy Shoemate are project directors).
- > Pritzker Foundation: \$40K award for Foster Youth/RISE support (Cyndi Palomino Bendezu is project director).
- Kaiser Foundation: \$15K to support mental health support in early childhood education (Monica Marshall is project director)
- Current awards total \$10.3M, and the team (Amber Cole and Stephenie Tesoro) will continue to research as pursue timely external funding to support college and program priorities going forward.

COC Awarded the Way Forward Grant

COC, working with Cerritos College, LACC, CSUDH, CSULA, CSUN, and the California Community Colleges' Success Network (3CSN) was just awarded the nationwide *The Way Forward* grant of \$12,000 by Bringing Theory to Practice.

- BTP is the nation's premier organization in higher education focused on civic learning and democratic engagement.
- This grant builds on an earlier grant addressing the need to create an intersegmental civic engagement pathway between the California Community College and California State University systems.
- Goals:
 - Promote a statewide undergraduate civic engagement common curriculum.
 - Facilitate a virtual faculty training introducing the topics of civic, community, and democratic engagement.
 - Organize a virtual convening of state and national academic leaders, government officials, and philanthropic organizations to discuss the need for civic learning and democratic engagement.



Canyon Country Campus Update

Construction progress continues at the Canyon Country Campus this winter.

- The Science Center will be ready for furniture delivery in April with most exterior work now complete.

Updates from Economic Development



The Economic Development Division has hit the ground running in 2021.

- > ETI and Instruction are partnering with the *International Facilities Management Association* (IFMA) San Fernando Valley Chapter to develop new curriculum that will get people back to work and into a new career field.
- Finalizing the curriculum for the **Low Observable** program in partnership with **Northrop Grumman** with the goal to launch a pilot cohort in late Q1. The program will be run through ETI and be funded through LA County WIOA money.
- Developing a **Ventura County Industry Council** to collectively represent manufacturing workforce needs. Haas Automation and Amgen along with approximately **30** other production industries will make up this county-wide association.
- The Health Workforce Initiative is offering a webinar to the community on **Friday, February 5th** entitled **Cultural and Linguistic Competence in Behavior Health Workforce Preparation**. See website for details.

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COC Named Finalist for Prestigious Bellwether Award



- The college was among 10 other colleges nominated in the Instructional Programs and Services category for its submission entitled "Dismantling Barriers to Support Students: Placement Exams & Developmental Courses." Typically there are over 400 submissions each year.
- The college's innovative approach to English and Mathematics assessment and course sequence design that has resulted in *increased student completion* in transfer-level English and Mathematics while greatly *reducing equity gaps*.
