College of the Canyons was recently selected as a **Top 10 Bellwether Finalist** for its submission entitled "*Dismantling Barriers to Support Students: Placement Exams & Developmental* courses."

- This nationally recognized **Bellwether Award** focuses on cutting-edge, trend-setting programs worthy of replication, where selected community colleges address critical issues through applicable research and the promotion of best practices addressing instructional programs and services.
- Our application highlights the College's innovative approach to **English** and **mathematics** assessment and course sequence design that has resulted in increased student completion in transfer-level English and mathematics while greatly reducing equity gaps.
- We will be competing on **January 25**, **2021** for the prestigious award via virtual pre-recorded presentation and live Q&A conducted by the *Virtual Community College Futures Assembly*.
- The Futures Assembly affords each finalist team an opportunity to provide a 60-minute presentation to an audience of their peers and an anonymous team of judges selected as subject-matter experts, policy leaders or respected practitioners in higher education.



Awarded Grant to Support Anti-Racism with OER


The Community College Consortium for OER (CCCOER), jointly with COC received a grant awarded by the *William and Flora Hewlett Foundation*, for an **Open for Anti-Racism (OFAR) Project** for the California community colleges.

- The one-year project aims to demonstrate how faculty can use open educational resources and open pedagogy to make instructional materials and their teaching more anti-racist.
- Participating faculty will learn about anti-racism, open educational resources, and open
 pedagogy in a newly developed course entitled Open for Anti-Racism (OFAR).
- Participation in the OFAR course is limited to 15 faculty (full-time or adjunct). Each will earn a \$500 stipend after completing the OFAR course, which includes developing an anti-racist action plan for implemention in a class they are teaching in spring 2021.
- Applications are due November 20 and notifications will be sent by December 7.




COC Voting Center

Updates from Economic Development

This week is **National Cyber Security Week**, and **Jeffrey Forrest** was asked by the *National Office of Apprenticeship* to serve on the Cyber Security subcommittee to discuss ways to scale apprenticeships nationwide.



- This week is also National Apprenticeship Week, and the Strong Workforce
 Apprenticeship Group (SWAG) at COC will be graduating 5 apprentices as CNC
 Operators this Thursday, November 12th at Lee's Enterprises, a local manufacturer.
- COC will be wrapping up its **Google IT Certification Program** this month with *Jobs for the Future*. The next step is for COC to integrate the program into its non-credit curriculum, were it can be offered at no charge to prospective students.
- The Strong Workforce Apprenticeship Group has submitted a proposal for **Cyber Security and Data Compliance Analyst**. This is a new occupation, and we are seeking national approval from the Department of Defense for this position.







Flu Clinic

On **Friday, November 6th from 1:00 p.m.- 4:00 p.m.,** the College's Incident Command Team conducted a Drive-Thru Flu Shot Clinic.

- Offered only to current students, the flu shots were distributed in Lot 15 while students remained in their cars.
- The 400 doses went a long way to address concerns during the COVID pandemic and responds to the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health's requirement that students receive a flu shot.






International Forum on Youth 2020


