College of the Canyons **Aerospace and Science Team** members working on NASA's *High-Altitude Student Platform (HASP)* project traveled to Texas on **Sunday, July 25**th for a week of integration and pre-launch testing.

The students, accompanied by **Teresa Ciardi** and **Gregory Poteat**, settled in at NASA's **Columbia Scientific Balloon Facility** in Palestine. The project will take flight from Fort **Sumner, New Mexico**, with a launch window commencing on **Sept. 2nd**.

Aerospace & Science Team student member **Kyle Strickland** has been hired as *a Spacecraft Electrical Systems Engineer* at Millennium **Space** focusing on PCB design and power electronics for satellites.

- Kyle Strickland is both a COC alum and CSUN alum who continues to mentor our COC Aerospace & Sciences Team members.





Heading to Stanford!

Last spring *HASP Electrical Engineer*, Michael Souliman graduated from Saugus High School *and* from COC with a degree in Computer Science, and is now heading to Stanford in the fall to pursue his dream of becoming a *math teaching* and develop *AI* that will differentiate the learning process for individual learners.

- While at COC, Michael has designed and built our HASP flight computer, taught others how to crimp wires and solder connections, led the team through testing all sensors, integrated our electrical system with the HASP payload deck, and has been working countless hours to fix computer code and write new code to get our HASP experiment working.
- During this week's launch preparations, Michael has demonstrated a bravery not typical of a student, approaching the NASA Program Director and support staff to ask specific questions so he can get our payload ready for flight.
- We are very proud of his accomplishments and know he will go on to do even greater things in the years to come!

Training Our Workforce!



Training the Next Generation of Machinists!

For over **30** years, COC has operated the **Center for Applied and Competitive Technologies** (**CACT**), which offers accelerated training for dislocated workers, Veterans and those with high-functioning Autism for jobs in advanced manufacturing.

In ramping up our efforts to train the next generation of machinists, COC has entered into a **partnership** with **B&B Manufacturing** to utilize its facilities for providing hands-on training for students.

- The training will take place on site at B&B manufacturing. Fred Duncan, the President and CEO of B&B has agreed to cover all maintenance and utilities cost incurred by COC at the site.
- Construction for the training center is underway, and the first cohort of students is scheduled to begin classes **January 2022**.
- Over 70 companies in the Santa Clarita Valley count on COC to provide quality machinists for their operations each year. This agreement will enable the College to keep its promise for years to come.
- The agreement with B&B is the first step in the colleges efforts to build and operate an Advanced Technology Center (ATC). The ATC, which will be over 50,000 square feet, and will house programs in *Construction, Welding, Manufacturing*, and *Logistics*.







Grants and State Budget Update

College Receives NSF Grant for Bee Research





College of the Canyons has received a \$74,707 *Campus as a Living Lab* (CALL) grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to provide opportunities for underrepresented community college students to engage in undergraduate research focusing on native bees.

- Using the campus landscape as a living lab, faculty and students will research native bee biodiversity with the intent to enrich campus habitats, foster increased biodiversity of native bee species and address the current rapid loss of biodiversity affecting ecosystem stability and pollination services.
- The project's goal is to create a strong foundation for establishing a sizeable future network of colleges that can use the available data to foster ongoing critical pollinator research opportunities for underrepresented student.
- Jeannie Chari, Professor of Biology/Environmental Science, developed the concept and application during the pandemic, assembling collaborators from two-year colleges in the U.S. and Argentina.

State Budget Update

Here is a summary of some of the main provisions for CCC from SB 132, as they could possibly impact COC:

- \$90 million one-time to support increases to part-time faculty office hours— COC \$150,000 (we are only eligible for up to half of the actual costs which for us are around \$500,000 and we already receive about \$100,000. This additional funding will be a bigger incentive for other Districts to actually file a claim);
- \$511 million one-time to support deferred maintenance projects COC \$7.5 M;
- \$50 million one-time for the continued implementation of the CCC Guided Pathways program COC -\$550,000;
- \$20 million one-time to support the implementation of best practices in promoting equal opportunity employment – COC - \$280,000;
- \$20 million for CCC to establish and expand High Road Training Partnerships and High Road Construction Careers – COC - \$280,000;
- > \$20 million one-time to support culturally competent professional development COC \$280,000; and
- \$10 million one-time to support LGBTQ+ students COC \$140,000.

Congressman Mike Garcia Secures Funds for ATC!

Congressman Mike Garcia submitted a **\$1 million** funding request to purchase equipment for the Advanced Technology Center.

- The funding would support the purchase of equipment for a state of art CNC production lab to prepare students for workforce readiness.
- The request was included in the 2022
 Labor, Health, and Human Services
 Appropriations Bill, which was approved in committee.
- After a full House vote, it will go to the Senate next

Student Hiring Spree Planned

College of the Canyons will do more than welcome students back into classrooms this fall. It will also put many of them on the payroll.

- To prepare for expansion of campus instruction and activities, more than \$500,000 of the college's *Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund* package will provide jobs at both campuses.
- We currently have 150-180 open jobs now available for students.





Boykin Modernization, Coming Soon!

This project entails the complete 'gutting' and interior upgrade of the Lab building, which has remained largely untouched since opening in 1974.

- This is a 50% state-match project, saving the district nearly \$5M in Measure E funds! Which is a very impressive fact in and of itself.
- We will retain the same number and type of science labs, service rooms and classrooms, which will be outfitted with entirely new, *state-of-the-art* interiors: cabinets, casework, fume hoods, lab tops, ceilings, floors, doors, everything. Behind the walls, all new plumbing, electrical and HVAC will also be replacing the OEM infrastructure.
- The building will also be seismically retrofitted (voluntarily, not mandated by any state agency), to current building codes.
- The project was submitted to DSA in October of 2020. The final piece of the 3-part DSA plan check process is scheduled for July 29, 2021. We expect to be 'stamped out' at that time, which would then allow us to start the final approval process, at the state Chancellor's Office. We expect a 6-week turnaround up in Sacramento, then it's off to the races: bidding, awarding contracts and, finally, starting construction on the 12-month project
