Grants Development Update

Child Care Assistance Means Parents In School (CCAMPIS) Award

New **\$1.37 million** grant from the U.S. Department of Education. A four-year project benefiting theCollege's Early Childhood Education Program with the opportunity to continue renewing the funding.

What does this mean for our Early Childhood Education Program?

- More student daycare hours and ECE staff support;
- Valencia ECE receives new flooring, outdoor play turf, cabinetry, and other upgrades;
- Support for enhancing the ECE re-opening at the Canyon Country Campus;
- Enhanced ECE classroom education technology include iPads; and
- Child psychologist to work with students and parents on identifying behavior issues early.

- The celebration was held at the Culinary Arts Cafe, and included a short ceremony, guest speakers, and a catered breakfast served by iCuE students.

Coronavirus Update Recent Highlights







- National COVID-19 community levels are low according to the CDC.
 - 77% are "low," 20% are "medium," and only 3% of counties are in the "high" transmission level.
 - LA County is in the **low** transmission category as of 10/10.
- **Statewide**, there are **8.3 cases per 100k** with a **4.7% positivity** rate as of 10/6, significantly **decreased** from **15.8** cases per 100k and **7.8%** positivity as of 9/9.
- Countywide, LA County averaged 9.5 cases per 100K and a 3.5% positivity rate as of 10/6, significantly decreased from 17.9 cases per 100K and 7.4% positivity as of 9/9.
- **The LA County DPH Health Order** was most recently updated from 9/22 to note that masks are no longer required (but recommended) in public transportation.
- The College continues to follows the latest developments and maintains a COVID-19 Containment, Response, and Control Plan online.




