College of the Canyons has been ranked nationally No. 17 in The Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education Magazine for enrolling the largest number of Hispanic students and granting the most degrees, respectively.

- The college was also ranked 9th among the Top 10 schools by major for its parks, recreation, leisure, fitness and kinesiology degree programs.
- The college had a Hispanic population of **15,410** students, totaling **49** percent of the total student enrollment, which was 31,696 in 2020-21.
- That same year, of the 3,200 associate degrees awarded by the college, **1,459** degree recipients were Hispanic.



Election of 2016, Series 2022




Summary of Series 2022 Bond Sale – Santa Clarita Community College District.


- On October 20th, the District sold \$70 million of tax-exempt general obligation bonds.
- The all-in true interest cost is 4.56%.
- ➤ The table below provides the estimated financing costs. Fees will be paid from the building fund and any contingency not used will be returned to the building fund.

- The aggregate debt service to repay the 2022 Bonds, assuming no prepayment, is \$144,467,003.13. This is a payback ratio of 2.06 : 1.
- \$69,427,000 will be deposited into the building fund on the November 10th closing date.



Coronavirus Update Recent Highlights







- > National COVID-19 community levels are low according to the CDC.
 - 79% are "low," 19% are "medium," and only 2% of counties are in the "high" transmission level.
 - LA County is in the low transmission category as of 11/7.
- > Statewide, there are 6.1 cases per 100k with a 4.5% positivity rate as of 11/7, decreased from 8.3 cases per 100k and 4.7% positivity as of 10/6.
- ➤ Countywide, LA County averaged 6.9 cases per 100K and a 3.5% positivity rate as of 11/7, significantly decreased from 9.5 cases per 100K and 3.5% positivity as of 10/6.
- The LA County DPH Health Order was most recently updated from 9/22 to note that masks are no longer required (but recommended) in public transportation. Higher ed guidance updated on 11/2 further aligned COVID guidance with CalOSHA and CDC standards.
- The College continues to follows the latest developments and maintains a COVID-19 Containment, Response, and Control Plan online.



Movie Under the Stars






The Canyon Country campus and ASG present a free outdoor screening of "Big Hero 6" on Friday, Nov. 18th.


