# Our COC Team and Students Stand Out!

#### **Athletics Update**

#### Men's Golf

- Canyons played its way to an 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive Western State Conference (WSC) Championship, and had three players tie for runnerup status in the individual standings, during the conference finals on April 25th.
- On Monday, Canyons finished in third place but just one shot back of the leader — at the CCCAA Southern California Regional Championships at Olivas Links Golf Course ... That performance allows the Cougars to advance to next week's State Championship event in Soboba Springs.
- This will mark the 25<sup>th</sup> time in program history that the Golf team will be completing at the state tournament







#### **Athletics Update**

#### Track & Field

- College of the Canyons claimed two individual Western State Conference (WSC) Championships, as Matthew Ballentine took the top spot in the javelin and Layne Buck won the long jump during the WSC Track & Field Prelims at Cougar Stadium on April 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- The following week, at the WSC Championships meet, COC finished eighth in the team standings on both the men's and women's side but had several individual student-athletes qualify to compete at the CCCAA Southern California Prelims last Friday.
- Based on those performances, Canyons will now send Ballentine, Buck and freshman Milca Osorio to complete across six events at the CCCAA SoCal Regional Championship meet this Friday, May 13th in Moorpark.







#### **Student Wins African Heritage Award**

Engineering major Jammal Yarbrough is one of 14 students, and the only community college student, from across the nation to be selected for the inaugural class of (*Tyco Electronics*) *TE Connectivity's African Heritage Scholarship Program*.

- The \$3.5 million scholarship program will create new opportunities in the technology industry for top-performing Black and African American students, while further diversifying the company's workforce.
- The two-year program includes a paid 10- to 12-week internship and scholarship funds of up to \$22,500 per year.
- Yarbrough will begin his paid internship at TE's aerospace, defense and marine business in Middletown, Penn. in just a month.





#### COC Students Win at California FBLA-PBL State Conference

Seven students from **COC Future Business Leaders of America** – **Phi Beta Lambda** competed at the *2022 Spring FBLA-PBL California State Business Leadership Conference* held in San Francisco on April 22-24<sup>th</sup>.

- Over 100 students from colleges and universities across California participated in the first in-person state conference held since 2019.
- Our team was able to bring home seven 1<sup>st</sup> place awards, three
   2<sup>nd</sup> place awards and two 3<sup>rd</sup> place awards.
- COC student Chanchol Krasaesin was elected to the California PBL state leadership team for the 2022-2023 term.

#### **Students to Participate in Lunar Mission**

The Astronomy & Physics Club has been selected to participate in *GLEE* (*Great Lunar Expedition for Everyone*), a science and technology mission to the surface of the Moon conducted by students from around the world.

- GLEE will mix space science, technology demonstrations, and hands-on activities, as well as test technology with hundreds of student-built "LunaSats.
- The project's lead organization is the Colorado Space Grant Consortium.




#### **Student Representation at the Voter Youth Summit**

 This work is meeting the requirements of AB 963, the *Student Civic and Voter Empowerment Act*.





#### **Equitable Course Placement Honors**





## \$646K to Support Welding Technology

The college has been awarded **\$646,345** from the National Science Foundation to support a *Welding Education Smart Technology* project, which will integrate smart technology platforms, paired with industryrecognized stackable certificates, into the curriculum to improve welding education. Key activities include:

- Outfitting the existing welding technology lab with state-of-the-art "smart" welding systems for more hands-on training time, instant assessment of welds, higher-quality training, and improved safety.
- Creating a pipeline of skilled works to meet industry demands.
- Aligning the curriculum to the smart technology students will encounter in the workforce.
- > An estimated **300** students will benefit during the grant period.

## **Engage the Vote Sign Painting**

The **Center for Civic Engagement** and its *Engage the Vote* and *PLACE Action Teams* partnered with Los Angeles **Artist Deborah Aschheim** on **April 13**<sup>th</sup> to pilot the first of several planned student *Get Out the Vote sign-making* activities to encourage participation in the upcoming June 7<sup>th</sup> California Primary.

- Signs will be displayed on campus closer to the election. Additional sign-making events will also take place this fall







#### "Ready to Work" Academy Returns

On hold for more than two years because of the pandemic, the *Ready to Work Academy* is returning to College of the Canyons.

- The program, a partnership between the college and Carousel Ranch, provides certificate courses and work experience to young adults with special needs.
- Courses offered include Workplace Skills in Customer Service for Retail, Food Service and Hospitality, and Warehouse Fulfillment and Logistics.
- Students participate in training courses and work experience at partner companies such as Starbucks, Holiday Inn Express, Bluemark, and AMS Fulfillment.

The **Multicultural Center** Grand Opening was held on **Monday, April 18**<sup>th</sup>.

- Keynote speaker Matt Sigelman shared data illustrating the unprecedented pace and shape of skill change required in the current workforce today, and pointed to the challenges and opportunities this creates for community colleges.

## **Spring Star Party**


The always-popular Star Party returned to the Canyon Country campus on **Friday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>**.




- A discussion on bio-diversity tips and techniques

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
