Future Business Leader's Earn National Honors



7 College of the Canyons students placed in the **top 10** nationally – including one national champion – during the *Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) Collegiate National Leadership Conference* in Atlanta June 22nd to 25th.


- The students were among more than 850 students across the nation who showcased their talents and competed for more than \$120,000 in scholarships.
- Our COC students competed in the Business Presentation category, the Sales Presentation category, the Impromptu Speaking event, the Public Speaking event, and individually in the Social Media Marketing category.

First 'Ready to Work' Graduation

The *Ready to Work Academy* celebrated its first graduating class during a ceremony at the University Center on June 22nd.

- A partnership between College of the Canyons and Carousel Ranch, the program provides certificate
 courses and work experience to young adults with
 special needs.
- 9 students completed the program, which encompassed two separate classes: Workplace Skills in Customer Service for Retail, Food Service and Hospitality, and the first pilot class in Culinary Arts.
- Students participated in classroom training and work experience at partner companies such as AMS Fulfillment, Bluemark, Salt Creek Grill, and Funburger.





COC Administrator and Faculty Receive Stanford Fellowships





Dr. Jia-Yi Cheng-Levine and Dr. Saburo Matsumoto are
Fellows in the 2023-24 Stanford EPOC Community
College Leaders and Faculty Fellowship program.

- The Education Partnership for Internationalizing Curriculum (EPIC) programs bring together a cohort of community college faculty and admnistrative leaders to work collaboratively with Stanford staff for one academic year (August 2023 – May 2024) on self-designed projects aimed at internationalizing core curricula and developing global competencies among community college students.
- It's a competitive process. For each year's fellowship, Stanford accepts only **10** for the Faculty Cohort (Dr. Matsumoto) and 6 for the Leaders Cohort (Dr. Cheng-Levine).
- Fellows attend a three-day intensive workshop at Stanford in early August, 2023; participate in monthly virtual seminars, develop a project, and present their project outcomes at the end-of-the-year symposium in May 2024.








Grants Development

Grants Development continues to support college program needs and strategic goals in collaboration with Instruction, Business Services, Student services, and many more. Recent grant highlights include:

- > **\$15,016,557** secured to-date for FY 22/23.
- \$14,183,381 secured for FY 23/24 so far due to multi-year awards.
- \$10 million in pending grant awards for future years.



Statewide Zero Textbook Cost Grant Program

James Glapa-Grossklag was selected as *Technical Assistance Provider* for the **State Chancellor's Office** to implement and support the **\$115M** state investment in **ZTC** grants. Major activities include:

- Design and manage grant application processes that may result in
 400+ awards to colleges.
- Create and offer professional development courses available to all colleges.
- Coordinate research and evaluation of the project.
- Establish and manage centralized OER support services for all colleges
- > Develop and support a community of practice for colleges to learn.
- Host in-person and virtual events.
- Document success stories with blog posts and case studies.
- Develop and deploy network of coaches to engage individually with colleges that need additional support.







Native Bee Biodiversity Research Grant

Received **\$500,000** *National Science Foundation (NSF)* award to support underrepresented college students in native bee research, community education and engagement, and habitat patch and corridor creation.

- Builds on existing RCN-UBE Incubator project by providing five years of funding for The BUZZ: Engaging Community College Students in Native Bee Biodiversity Research.
- Only 8-12 projects nationally receive funding at this level each year!
- To date: 54 students mentored by 15 faculty from 11 MSI community colleges.
- Our Goal Grow our team to 60 faculty, Provide research experience to hundreds of students through mentoring and course-based research AND increase biodiversity through habitat creation and enrichment.

Grant Supports Native Americans

College of the Canyons has been awarded a **\$1.5 million** grant from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office to fund a **Native American Student Support and Success Program**.

- The five-year grant will allow the college to provide support for the educational success of Native American students and strengthen K–12 pathways to and through the California Community College system, including student transfer to the University of California and the California State University systems.
- The grant will also help students connect with Native American mentors to empower and develop leadership skills.
- Currently, the college has a Native American and Indigenous Alliance that helps Native American students navigate college, connect with mentors, meet with counselors and financial aid advisors, and discuss issues in a safe and welcoming space.


PAC Tickets on Sale Now
