Renard Thomas Honored at SCV Chamber 11th Annual Salute to Patriots Event

Veterans Resource Center Director, Renard Thomas was among six honorees recognized at today's *SCV Chamber of Commerce 11th Annual Salute to Patriots* event, which honors local veterans for their service to our nation and leadership in our business community.

- ➤ The Veterans were nominated by chamber members and local residents throughout October.
- Renard served in the **Army and Army Reserves** for over **20** years, and was deployed for **18** months in **Operation Iraqi Freedom!**
- Under Renard's leadership, the *Veterans Resource Center* serves more than **600** veteran students attending COC.
- > Dr. Jasmine Ruys presented Renard his recognition award at the event



College Ranked 19th Nationally

College of the Canyons has been ranked **No. 19** nationally by **The Hispanic Outlook on Education magazine** for enrolling the largest number of Hispanics.

- The Top 100 Community Colleges for Hispanics rankings used enrollment data for fall 2019 and spring 2020, which recorded a Hispanic population of **15,528** students, or **47** percent of total student enrollment.
- College data shows that over a five-year period, there was a **163 percent** increase in the number of Hispanic students earning an Associate's Degree for Transfer (ADT). Students who earn an ADT were guaranteed admission to a California State University.









It has been an action-packed semester for College of the Canyons Athletics!

Cross Country:

- COC freshman Danielle Salcedo won the CCCAA
 SoCal Regional Championship with a time of
 17:55.1 on the course at Mile Square Regional Park,
 becoming the first runner in women's cross country
 program history to do so. Salcedo remains
 undefeated in community college events for the
 2021.
- Canyons placed seventh in the team standings and will advance to the *CCCCAA State Championship* meet on Nov. 20th at Woodward Park in Fresno





Women's Soccer:

- COC women's soccer is back on top after claiming the program's 12th Western State Conference (WSC), South Division championship, and first since 2017, while also clinching a postseason trip for the 10th straight season.
- Canyons (13-4-1, 10-1-1) wrapped up the regular season with a 2-0 road win at Citrus College last night.
- COC will now wait for postseason seeding.

Women's Basketball:

- Canyons opened its 2021-22 season by going 3-0 at the Santa Barbara MXTE Tourney Nov. 5-7.
- Included were wins over Butte, L.A. Southwest and Ohlone College. COC head coach Greg Herrick, currently in his 30th year and 29th season, sits at 594 career wins and continues the march toward 600.







Women's Volleyball:

- No. 25 ranked College of the Canyons won its fourth straight match in the form of a 3-0 victory over West L.A. College on Friday.
- Canyons has dropped just two matches dating back to Oct. 13 and is second in the WSC, South standings still vying for a postseason spot.

Women's Golf:

Canyons finished sixth at the CCCAA Southern California Regional Championships on Monday, with a four-player, two-day score of 774 (386/388). COC sophomore Nisha Gaulke will advance to compete as an individual in the state championship tourney.







Men's Basketball:

- COC began its season by winning the 'Clash at Canyons' Tip-Off Event held in the Cougar Cage on Nov. 4 & 6.
- Canyons defeated Oxnard College 102-82 in the opener, then posted a 116-84 win over Barstow College in the championship game.
- Freshman Andrew Henderson was named the tournament's Most
 Outstanding Player and freshman Jimmy Galgano was named to the
 all-tournament team.

Football:

- The Cougars are still in the hunt for a postseason berth despite having lost back-to-back games to East L.A. and Ventura College.
- Canyons continues to rank No. 7 in the state but will need to win its upcoming game at Long Beach City College on Saturday








Division Meetings


