



COCMUN Team Competes in CanyonsMUN

Our athletes are back for spring conditioning through summer!


- Over 170 athletes and coaches came back to campus on Monday, April 12th, for their COVID testing.

- We will be conditioning outdoors only, to prepare our athletics teams to get back into competition this fall.








Annual Juried Student Art Exhibition

- In doing so, she set the **program record** for **most consecutive singles wins** (11) and ranks second with seven consecutive Western State Conference (WSC) singles wins. Her career total of 11 singles wins is tied for the program's No. 2 mark.



Aerospace Team Gets Lift from NASA



For the fifth time in a row, the College of the Canyons

Aerospace and Sciences Team (AST) has been
selected to participate in NASA's High Altitude

Student Platform (HASP) program!

- ➤ NASA has selected **11 student teams** to launch scientific payloads on a NASA heavy-lift balloon for the **15**th **High-Altitude Student Platform** mission flying during the fall 2021 campaign in Fort Sumner, New Mexico.
- Our team plans to build a compact scintillator which converts high-energy radiation to a visible light—to detect gamma rays and neutrinos in the upper stratosphere.






- Fulfillment, and others on forklift Training and other courses related to distribution and logistics.

"Empowered Women: Health, Wellness, Balance" was the theme for last month's College of the Canyons Women's Conference.


- The three-day virtual conference featured a variety of breakout sessions that were designed to re-energize, refresh and inspire.





Meeting with the Tri-Valley Alliance for Higher Education

Dr. Torres and I were invited to attend the *Tri-Valley Alliance for Higher Education* coalition meeting on **April 27**th by CSUN's new President, **Dr. Erika Beck.** Among the subjects that will be covered will be:

- General Education and Ethnic Studies Requirements;
- Enrollment and Long-Term Planning; and
- > Transfer Success Initiatives
- The Tri-Valley Alliance for Higher Education was organized in spring 1974 as a loose coalition of institutions of higher education in the San Fernando, Simi, and Antelope Valleys and adjacent areas.
- The Alliance was founded to "create an atmosphere conducive to sharing information on academic and administrative topics of mutual interest."
- ➤ Its purpose is to provide a framework to promote strong, cooperative partnerships and foster educational welfare on our campuses and in the community.
