## **COC** a Top College for Hispanics

College of the Canyons has been ranked nationally No. 17 in The Hispanic Outlook in Higher Education Magazine for enrolling the largest number of Hispanic students and granting the most degrees, respectively.

- The college was also ranked 9<sup>th</sup> among the Top 10 schools by major for its parks, recreation, leisure, fitness and kinesiology degree programs.
- The college had a Hispanic population of **15,410** students, totaling **49** percent of the total student enrollment, which was 31,696 in 2020-21.
- That same year, of the 3,200 associate degrees awarded by the college, **1,459** degree recipients were Hispanic.

- > Child psychologist to work with students and parents on identifying behavior issues early.



#### **Grants Development Update**

**Grants Development**, under Director **Amber Cole**, continues to collaborate with many partners to support program needs and strategic goals, including Instruction, Business Services, Student Services, and more.

Recent office highlights include:

- > \$14,112,050 secured to-date for FY22/23
- > \$16 million in pending grant awards
- ➤ Participation by Amber Cole in the CASE Federal Funders

  Taskforce (FFTF) in Washington, D.C, which included the latest intel and updates from 14 Federal agencies such as the Departments of Education, Commerce, Energy, Justice, Labor, as well as the National Science Foundation, EPA, NIH, and more—representing over 235 hours of collective work by the taskforce.
- Amber and Ryan also presented a **CASE conference** session on best practices in community college grants offices.

- The celebration was held at the **Culinary Arts Cafe**, and included a short ceremony, guest speakers, and a catered breakfast served by iCuE students.




## **Employment Center Open House**

# **New ASU Transfer Partnership**


College of the Canyons is partnering with **Arizona State University** to provide students a seamless transfer experience with the *MyPath2ASU* program.
