

## Minutes from 5/11 Meeting

## 1) ASG Grant Update

- Great news! We received a \$1,000 ASG Grant, so we will be able to start using that funding after the 2022-2023 fiscal year is over. This money provides more flexibility especially in regards to being able to purchase food, movie tickets, etc..
- 2) Cap and Gown Update
  - The group decided at the last meeting that instead of the 22 packs being distributed on a first come, first served basis, instead we partnered with the BaNC and they helped to identify 22 graduating students in financial need who may not be able to afford the cap and gown packs for Commencement. Joanna sent out the email to those students this past week and 1 has already emailed saying that they are not in need of it. This cap and gown has already been reallocated to another student in need that Saideh from our Counseling Team identified as possibly in need of it.
- 3) The group agreed to cancel the May 25 meeting because the next meeting is the week before Finals and staff are still busy wrapping up the semester.
- 4) Abigail Campos, a nursing student at COC joined the meeting as a student panelist. Hilary invited this student panelist.

- This has been brought up before about students joining CC. While it may not be beneficial for a student to come to all our meetings since it is staff led, it may be valuable to have a designated volunteer for Canyons Cares at campus wide events, bring up concerns/comments to CC at meetings as needed and in general, serve as the student liaison. It will be great to have a more permanent student perspective.
